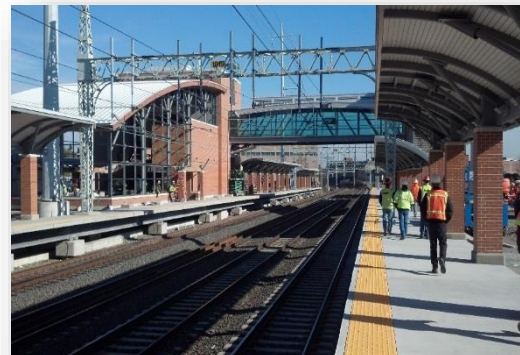
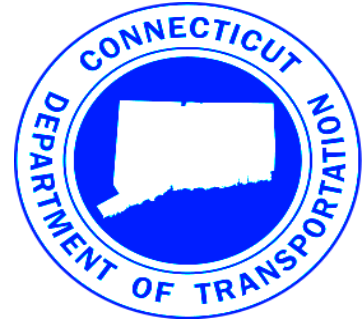


Dear Citizens of Connecticut:

Introduction

Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT) programs, facilities and the public rights-of-way are required to be accessible to persons with disabilities through the following Federal Statutes: Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 and Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA).

The Rehabilitation Act of 1973

The Rehabilitation Act of 1973 is a national law that protects qualified individuals from discrimination based on disability and makes it illegal for the federal government, federal contractors, and any entity receiving federal financial assistance to discriminate on the basis of disability. Section 504 obligates state and local governments to ensure that persons with disabilities have equal access to any programs, services, or activities receiving federal financial assistance. Covered entities are also required to ensure that their employment practices do not discriminate on the basis of disability.

The Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA)

The ADA is built upon the foundation laid by Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act. While Section 504 applies only to entities receiving federal financial assistance, the ADA covers all state and local governments, including those that receive no federal financial assistance. The ADA also applies to private businesses that meet the ADA's definition of "public accommodation" (restaurants, hotels, movie theaters, doctors' offices, etc.), commercial facilities (office buildings, factories, and warehouses), and many private employers.

The ADA has five separate titles, Title II is the section specifically applicable to "public entities" (state and local governments) and the programs, services, and activities they deliver. The Department of Justice (DOJ), through its Civil Rights Division, is the key agency responsible for enforcing Title II and for coordinating other federal agencies' enforcement activities under Title II.

United States Department of Justice regulations designate the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) as the agency responsible for overseeing public agencies' compliance with the ADA. The USDOT in turn has delegated to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) the responsibility to ensure ADA compliance in the public right-of-way and on projects using surface transportation funds.

The ADA requires public agencies with more than 50 employees to develop a transition plan in the event that structural changes to facilities are needed to achieve program accessibility. Due to the size of CTDOT and recognition that there are numerous physical barriers which impact the access of persons with disabilities, the above titled transition plan has been developed.

Background

In February 2007, CTDOT began working on an approach to fulfill the ADA requirement of a roadway Self-Assessment and Transition Plan. Since the Self-Assessment is a review of all CTDOT policies/procedures relating to ADA compliance, CTDOT and FHWA agreed that this review and update would occur concurrently with the crafting of the Transition Plan. As part of that process, CTDOT finalized its strategic plan on how it intended to conduct the ADA Self-Evaluation and the Transition Plan.

The strategic plan identified how CTDOT would evaluate its employment practices, communications, facilities, and public rights-of-way. CTDOT established a core team and utilized other resources to perform individualized tasks as appropriate. The Plan was sent out for public comment. Comments were addressed and the FHWA approved CTDOT's Interim ADA Transition Plan on February 10, 2009. The Plan was revised again in 2011.

The ADA Transition Plan for Public Rights of Way was revised in July 2015, to include ADA in Employment, Enforcement, Communications, and Facilities; in addition to the Public Right of Way. The draft Plan was posted online for public input and an email was sent to Disability Contacts/Organizations for their comment. No comments on the content of the plan were received.

The ADA Transition Plan was updated again in May 2017. As done previously, the Plan was emailed to Disability Organizations and contacts across and on CTDOT's website. No comments were received on the May 2017 update.

The ADA Transition Plan most recently was revised in July 2019. The Plan was again sent to Disability Organizations and contacts across the State requesting input, comment, and suggestions for improvement. This Plan was also posted on CTDOT's website along with a press release requesting public comment.

ADA/504 Working Group Structure

Responsibility for the ADA/504 Transition Plan updating and implementation is currently shared by a Transportation Principal Engineer on a part-time basis and the Equal Employment Opportunity Director, who provide regular reports to the executive-level Quarterly Meeting on Civil Rights, which includes the Commissioner and Bureau Chiefs. A designated full-time Transportation Engineer 3 is currently being recruited for updating and implementing the ADA/504 Transition Plan, and coordinating with all five bureaus within the CTDOT (Administration, Highway Operations, Policy and Planning, Engineering and Construction, Public Transportation). Representatives from each bureau report on

progress for their respective areas, and together with the Transportation Engineer and Equal Employment Opportunity Director, make up the ADA/504 Working Group.

CTDOT's ADA Policy and Programs

It is CTDOT policy not to discriminate against qualified individuals with disabilities in any of its employment practices, programs, services or activities. CTDOT is committed to equal opportunity for qualified persons with disabilities and their right to participate in the mainstream of American Life. CTDOT's ADA policy is documented in Policy Statement EX.O.-17 Americans with Disabilities Policy (See Appendix Section 2) The CTDOT's Acting Human Resources Administrator, Wanda Seldon, reviews all requests for ADA accommodations by employees and has decision making authority to approve or deny requests on behalf of CTDOT. All denials of requests for accommodations can be appealed by contacting the Office of Equal Opportunity & Diversity's Equal Employment Opportunity Director, Eric Smith. The CTDOT's ADA policies are posted on all bulletin boards, on the CTDOT website, and are included in the annual Affirmative Action Plan. All new employees are given a copy of the policy through the New Employee Orientation program.

Office of Equal Opportunity & Diversity

The Office of Equal Opportunity & Diversity is responsible for coordinating and enforcing the CTDOT compliance with the ADA and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act. The Commissioner has designated Mr. Eric Smith, Equal Opportunity Director, as the ADA Coordinator for external services (highways and public transportation). The general public is informed about ADA as it applies to CTDOT services via the website. The Title II – Americans with Disabilities Act/Section 504 Notice and the Title II ADA/504 Complaint Procedure and associated forms may be found on CTDOT's website under Affirmative Action and Accessibility/ADA (See Appendix Section 2). Service Areas have notices posted naming the ADA Coordinator and explaining that CTDOT is committed to providing accessible services, programs and activities. The policies posted on the website can be viewed in any language and in html format. Policies can be provided in Braille or audio format upon request.

Members of the public having complaints or concerns alleging violations of Title II of the ADA or Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act in reference to any service or program funded through CTDOT should contact the CTDOT's ADA Coordinator, Eric Smith. Mr. Smith will assure that the matter is addressed, investigated, or referred to an appropriate investigatory authority. The complaint evaluation process will begin within 15 days of receipt of the complaint with notification to the Complainant of CTDOT's receipt of the complaint. The evaluation will be completed within 90 days, whereby the Complainant will receive written notification of the results of the review. A copy of the policy, ADA Notice, complaint procedure, and complaint form can also be found in the Appendix Section 2.

Communications

- CTDOT has policies and procedures in place to honor requests from the general public for sign language interpreters. The CTDOT has also contracted with Voiance to provide over the telephone interpretation services. In the event an individual with Limited English Proficiency (LEP) calls to request language accommodations, any CTDOT employee with an assigned Voiance PIN can access the system and engage in a three way telephone conversation with a certified translator.
- TTY (Text Telephone/Telecommunication Device for the Deaf): All public notices provide instruction for those who are hearing impaired to call 711 (Telecommunications Relay Service) to contact CTDOT to request accommodations. To utilize the system, the hearing impaired individual calls 711, connects to an operator, and the 711 operator calls CTDOT and interprets the call. The service is free to both the caller and CTDOT and can be accessed by the hearing impaired caller via a text phone (TTY). The following is an example of the language to be included on all public notices:
"The meeting facility is ADA accessible. Persons needing ADA accommodations may request assistance by contacting (860) 594-2109. Persons having a hearing and/or speech disability may dial 711 for Telecommunications Relay Service (TRS) and instruct the operator to contact (860) 594-2243. Persons needing language assistance may request assistance by contacting the Department's Language Assistance Line at (860) 594-2109. Please make requests at least five (5) business days prior to the meeting. The Department will make every effort to accommodate reasonable requests for ADA accommodations and/or language assistance."
- CTDOT's website design is controlled by BEST (Bureau of Enterprise Systems and Technology) and all state website templates are the same. Documents posted to CTDOT's website (announcements, policies, etc.) are in html or PDF format and can be viewed with a screen reader.

Facilities

CTDOT owns, leases, and operates various public and non-public buildings throughout the State of Connecticut, which include administrative offices, maintenance, and operations facilities along with public transportation facilities. While CTDOT has and continues to upgrade non-public facilities, which include accessibility for our employees, public transit facilities are treated with equal priority for the traveling public.

Railroad Passenger Service


The New Haven Line – Operated by the [Metropolitan Transit Authority \(MTA\)](#) through the Metro North Railroad Company (MNRR) for CTDOT since 1983, this is one of the oldest commuter rail systems and also the 2nd busiest in the United States. The existing agreement enables MNRR to provide rail service from New Haven to Grand Central Terminal in New York City, as well as three branch lines that terminate in New Canaan, Danbury, and Waterbury. CTDOT owns and has capital responsibility for rail property along the route on the Connecticut side of the rail corridor, which includes (38) rail stations. Several rail stations along this route were constructed prior to 1900 and raised platforms were constructed at most stations during the 1970's. The larger urban “key stations” have either been constructed or renovated to include ADA access during the last twenty years. While there are stations along the line that are not ADA compliant, future projects will address these concerns. Topography, age of station, lease agreements, cost sharing, and the lack of space are factors that need to be addressed. CTDOT has replaced most of the rolling stock with M8 rail passenger cars which are ADA compliant. The current [online](#) and paper rail  timetable schedule uses a symbol to indicate which railroad stations are ADA compliant and which ones are currently not.

Shore Line East (SLE) -

Introduced in 1990 as an alternate means of travel during the reconstruction on Interstate 95 north and east of New Haven has proven popular with the traveling public and has remained in service ever since with typically over 2000 commuters daily. This rail service provides service along a portion of the Northeast Corridor from New Haven to New London, with 8 total stations. As of 2019, all stations except New London, which is owned by Amtrak, are fully ADA compliant.

Hartford Line – The Hartford Line is a high speed intercity passenger rail system that opened in June of 2018, providing expanded service between the cities of New Haven, Hartford, and Springfield, Massachusetts. The new line provides up to 17 round trips per day along the 62-mile route and included recent major infrastructure investment to upgrade the line to support frequent service. As part of the project, three new rail stations were built in Wallingford, Meriden, and Berlin, and both State Street and Union Station in Hartford were retrofitted for ADA compliance. Future stations include a new Windsor Locks station, an existing retrofit of Windsor station, and potential new stations in Enfield, West Hartford, Newington, and North Haven. All these stations will be constructed to be fully ADA compliant.

CTFastrak

CTFastrak is a dedicated bus rapid transit line along an exclusive 9.4 mile corridor between downtown New Britain and downtown Hartford. The system was launched in March of 2015, and operates 7 days a week under the CTtransit Hartford division. The guideway also consists of (10) dedicated platform transit stations located between the cities of New Britain and Hartford, equipped with handicap accessible ramps, variable messaging systems with real time schedules, tactile warning strips, and voice actuators to read schedules. All stations are fully ADA compliant. CTFastrak also permits bus access at intermediate points, so that circulator buses that provide service on routes in surrounding neighborhoods can then use the busway corridor, thus providing a one seat ride. In addition, CTFastrak includes Express Bus and connecting feeder bus service to surrounding towns.

Highway Service Plazas

There are currently 23 highway service plazas that were constructed during the 1940's along State Route 15, which includes the historic Merritt Parkway, and during the 1950's along Interstates 95 and 395 and included automobile service, fueling, restaurants, mercantile, and public restrooms. All plazas have been either fully renovated or replaced during the last decade, and are now fully ADA compliant. While the plazas no longer provide automobile service, fueling, restaurants, mercantile, and public restrooms are included.

Highway Rest Areas

There are currently seven active highway rest areas that were constructed in the 1970's and were renovated in various phases over the last fifty years. The active rest areas are fully ADA complaint with the exception of truck parking access to the building at the Wallingford and Willington westbound locations and picnic access at the Willington westbound location. Plans to correct these non-compliance issues through the Office of Maintenance are underway and are expected to be completed within the next two years.

There is also one additional highway rest area in Westbrook that is currently closed to the public and is not being maintained.

Highway Administration Facilities

The agency is headquartered in a dedicated Administrative facility centrally located in Newington with five outlying District Offices and an employee Motor Pool/Fueling Facility that is used by several Agencies. These facilities are often accessed by the public, each with varying ADA compliance:

- Administrative Headquarters, Newington: Built in 1992 with a fully complaint first floor building interior and 75% complaint exterior. Parking is divided into 2 main areas and the larger area was made compliant in 2016. Future site related projects will bring the second main parking area into compliance.
- Motor Pool/Fueling Facility, Newington: Built in 1994 and fully ADA complaint at that time.
- District 1 Office, Rocky Hill: Built in 1960 with general ADA compliance issues, building currently slated for renovation in 2026 which will correct compliance issues.
- District 2 Office, Norwich: Built in 1958 with extensive renovations in 1994, facility is fully compliant.
- District 3 Office, New Haven: Built in 1950 with extensive renovations in 1994, facility is fully compliant.
- District 4 Office, Thomaston – Built in 1987, facility has good overall access but restrooms are not compliant. There are currently no plans to renovate this facility or improve compliance over the next ten years.
- District 5 Office, New Haven – Built in 2016, facility is fully compliant and is only a small portion of the Component Change Out Shop in the New Haven Rail Yard.

Capital Projects*

As the number of rail commuters increases with time, rail infrastructure upgrades are either underway or are planned, which include new passenger rail stations and upgrades to existing ones.

The New Haven Line

- Merritt 7 – Raised platform and crossover (2019)
- Stamford Metro Station – Parking Garage and Pedestrian Bridge (2019) and Station Building Improvements (2021)
- Darien Station – Platform Improvements (2019)

SLE

- Clinton– Building additions and crossovers (2019)
- Madison – Building addition and crossovers and Parking Garage (2021)

NHHS

- Windsor Locks – Relocate Station (2020)
- Windsor Station - Upgrade Platform (2021)
- North Haven Station – New Station (2021)
- West Hartford Station – New Station (2022)
- Newington Station – New Station (2023)
- Enfield Station – New Station (2023)

Maintenance

Ongoing maintenance of each facility is provided by CTDOT staff and by maintenance contract agreements depending on type, size, and location of facility. All facility maintenance agreements include the upkeep and continuance of accessibility features. A comprehensive list of CTDOT facilities is contained in the Appendix.

Public Right of Way

Sidewalks and Curb Ramps

Background

The responsibility for maintenance and repair of existing sidewalks and curb ramps along State owned highways falls upon the municipality in which they are located except for: (i) sidewalks on State maintained bridges and their approaches, consistent with Sections 13a-91 and 13a-92 of the Connecticut General Statutes; and (ii) sidewalks located on property acquired for highway purposes, from the date of acquisition until the section of highway for which the property was acquired is completed, consistent with Section 13a-258 of the Connecticut General Statutes. Other than these exceptions, the Department has no obligation under the Connecticut General Statutes to maintain sidewalks that are located within the State's highway right-of-way. While the statutes technically exempt the Department from having to include sidewalks and curb ramps in this ADA Transition Plan, the Department has an obligation to insure that accessibility barriers on pedestrian facilities in the State ROW are being systematically removed by municipalities through their ADA Transition Plans when not being addressed by the Department through other activities. Continued communication and cooperation between the Department, municipalities, Council of Government's (COG) and Metropolitan Planning Organization's (MPO) is essential to create and maintain a pedestrian network free from accessibility barriers.

Any entity (CTDOT, Municipality, Private Developer/Permittee) which undertakes a project in the State Right of Way (ROW) must address any permanent and temporary accessibility barriers impacted by the improvement. On May 31, 2019, the Department issued an [Engineering Directive](#) adopting the Public Right of Way Accessibility Guidelines (PROWAG) for use in the development of updated accessibility design guidance. From this point on, any design element which does not satisfy PROWAG requirements needs to be documented and approved using the [CTDOT ADA Technical Infeasibility Form](#). In addition to the updated design guidance, ten (10) new PROWAG compliant [curb ramp guide sheets](#) were issued by the Department in February of this year.

Existing Conditions

An assessment of curb ramps at all intersections on State owned highways and at mid-block crossings was completed in 2014 using 2013 imagery from the Department's Digital Highway Photolog System. The four (4) different ratings that were used to describe the condition at a pedestrian crossing are as follows:

- Existing concrete curb ramp with tactile warning strip-assumed to be built according to current ADA requirements;
- Existing curb ramp (bituminous or concrete) without tactile warning strip, assumed to be partially non-compliant;
- No curb ramp at pedestrian crossing; and
- No curb ramp at location of traffic signal pushbutton.

The results of this initial assessment indicate that most curb ramps in the State's highway right-of-way are not fully compliant with current ADA requirements. [Webmaps](#) have been created to show the location and condition of curb ramps statewide at that time.

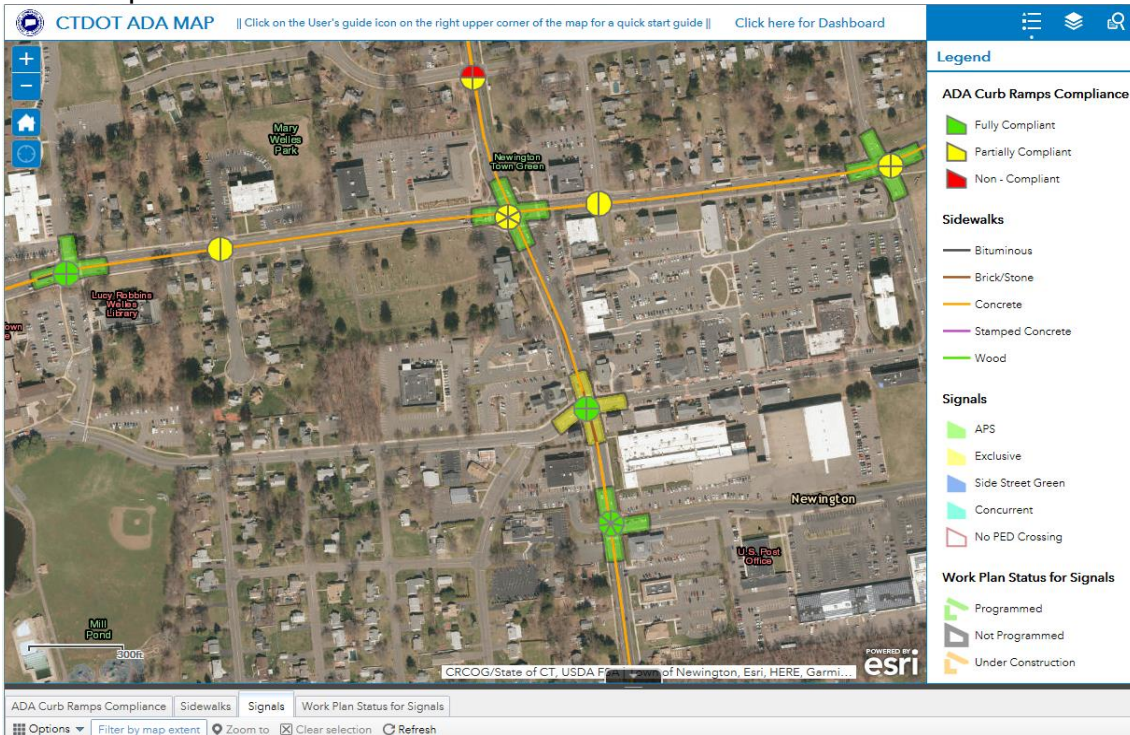


Figure 6: CTDOT ADA Map

Since this initial survey in 2014, over 2000 new curb ramps have been installed through CTDOT projects. Recognizing field conditions constantly change and degrade over time, the inventory of accessibility barriers needs to be continuously updated. Systems are being developed to allow us to determine locations of programmed curb ramps activity in design projects, as well as an inspection tool to locate and validate that newly constructed or existing curb ramps and, other pedestrian facilities, in the State ROW are ADA compliant. These systems should be coming online in the next year and will be incorporated into the design and construction of all CTDOT projects. A comprehensive update to the curb ramp inventory that reflects work completed by the Department and others (municipalities and private developers) will be undertaken once these new systems are online.

The information derived from these systems will allow CTDOT to more clearly demonstrate to municipalities and stakeholders where accessibility barriers are planned to be removed and where barriers remain. Sharing this information with Municipalities on a continuous basis will allow them to more easily prioritize planned improvements contained in their ADA Transition Plan.

Accessibility Barrier Removal

As noted earlier, statutory authority to maintain sidewalks and curb ramps in the State's ROW lies predominantly with the municipality where it is located, however, CTDOT does significantly participate in pedestrian facility improvements through new construction/alteration projects in the Capital Plan and the annual pavement resurfacing program.

CTDOT recognizes it has oversight responsibility to insure municipalities are fulfilling their ADA/Title II responsibilities and will look to provide technical and financial support to insure that progress is being made to remove accessibility barriers statewide. CTDOT continues to review existing programs for opportunities to fund municipal projects for accessibility barrier removal in the public ROW.

It is anticipated that through the combined efforts of CTDOT and the 169 municipalities that the state ROW will have ADA compliant curb ramps within 15 years.

5-Year Capital Plan

CTDOT develops and maintains a [5-Year Capital Plan](#) which represents CTDOT proposed program of highway and bridge, public transportation, and facility capital projects. The plan is a cooperative effort between CTDOT's operating bureaus, regional planning agencies, and Capital Services to prioritize projects and come up with a plan that utilizes available funds in the most efficient way. CTDOT has developed the [TED Map](#) to show the location of all active Capital Projects in planning, design, and construction. The webpage has an advanced search feature which allows the user to find a project by address, town, political district, etc. Sidewalks or curb ramps constructed or reconstructed along State highways by projects in this program, require the municipality in which the pedestrian facility is located to enter into an agreement with the State to assume full responsibility for their maintenance and liability as noted in CTDOT Policy E&C No.19-Sidewalks.

Annual Pavement Resurfacing Program: Vendor-In-Place (VIP) and Pavement Preservation

In the summer of 2013, the DOT/DOJ issued the Joint Technical Assistance on Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act Requirements to Provide Curb Ramps when Streets, Roads, or Highways are Altered through Resurfacing. Prior to the issuance of this document, CTDOT had not considered curb ramps in the scope of the resurfacing program.

The Vendor in Place (VIP) typically covers 200 two-lane miles annually and will upgrade any ADA non-compliant curb ramps at state road pedestrian crossings, and when practical, will upgrade non-compliant curb ramps at local road pedestrian crossings impacted by other improvements. The TED Map also shows the limits of

the current year's VIP program as well as selected prior years' programs. The inventory of curb ramps is currently being updated to reflect the curb ramps that have been constructed by the VIP. Curb ramps for state pedestrian crossings that weren't constructed by the VIP program due to utility or right-of-way conflicts are currently being evaluated, and sites that are not deemed technically infeasible, will be programmed for inclusion in a construction project. CTDOT is dedicating \$6,000,000 annually for curb ramp construction in support of the VIP.

The Preservation Program has historically focused on higher volume roadways with limited pedestrian amenities or maintenance treatments which do not trigger ADA upgrades. As CTDOT migrates towards a more data-driven, asset management based resurfacing program the Preservation Program will become a more significant contributor to curb ramp construction statewide.

Community Connectivity Program

CTDOT continues to administer the "[Community Connectivity Program](#)," an output of the 5-Year Capital Plan, designed to improve conditions for walking and bicycling to and within urban, suburban and rural community centers. The goal of this Program is to make conditions safer and more accommodating for pedestrians and bicyclists, thereby encouraging more people to use these healthy and environmentally sustainable modes of travel. One component of the Community Connectivity Program is to offer Connecticut's towns and cities assistance to conduct a Road Safety Audit (RSA) at important bike and pedestrian corridors and intersections. CTDOT completed 88 RSA's over the past two years.

Another component of the Community Connectivity Program is to administer a Community Connectivity Grant Program (CCGP) to provide funding for targeted infrastructure improvements that are commonly identified through RSA's, or other transportation planning initiatives. The objective of the CCGP was to provide construction funding directly to Municipalities that would result in smaller scale infrastructure improvements that are aligned with the overall program goals. CTDOT solicited applications for grants directly from Municipalities for grants ranging from \$75,000 to \$400,000. There were 80 towns that submitted applications for a total of approximately \$25 million in needs. Applications were evaluated based on specific criteria such as program goal relevance.

Another component of the Community Connectivity Program is to administer the Critical Pedestrian Safety Improvements Initiative. CTDOT is administering the design and construction phases by upgrading the safety of pedestrian crossings with a high risk of motor vehicle crashes involving pedestrians and/or cyclists. These can be crossings with a history of such crashes, or with a high risk of crashes and the potential for serious injuries due to the combination of high vehicle speeds and a high volume of pedestrians or cyclists. Requests for help solving serious pedestrian safety problems often come from communities that recently experienced crashes involving serious injuries or fatalities at pedestrian crossings, or where numerous

near misses are reported to town officials or local police. Often these are crossings in community centers, or at major pedestrian activity centers such as schools, and colleges.

Some of the completed RSA's identified serious safety problems that can be addressed with modest improvements. Current projects are being administered on Route 10 in Cheshire, Bishops Corner in West Hartford, Route 32 in New London, Route 20 in East Granby, and Route 104 in Stamford. In addition, Route 1 in southwestern CT was identified as having the highest number of pedestrian fatalities in the State. CTDOT conducted a series of RSA's within 5 towns (Greenwich, Stamford, Norwalk, Darien, and Westport) covering over 22 miles to identify needs and opportunities for improvements that will enhance pedestrian safety along this corridor. The reason Route 1 was chosen at the time is because CTDOT was performing the RSA concurrently with the CTDOT's Vendor-In-Place (VIP) Pavement Resurfacing project on Route 1. CTDOT had a wonderful opportunity to incorporate some of the safety improvements identified during the Route 1 RSA within the VIP project. Recommendations from other RSAs will also be implemented during future VIP pavement resurfacing projects where practical.

Active Transportation Plan

CTDOT completed the [Active Transportation Plan](#) in January 2019. It lays out a multi-pronged approach to meet the needs of the non-motorized bicycle and pedestrian population and present projects and policies that will immediately improve the safety, connections, and accessibility for the residents and visitors of Connecticut. The Plan presents construction projects to be undertaken and initiated over the next five (5) years to improve safety and accessibility for cyclists and pedestrians in the most critical locations in the State. Under this Plan, the State Bicycle Map was also completely redone. An Interactive Bicycle Map utilizes the latest technology to assist designers in creating bike/ped friendly roadways, where suitable.

Crosswalks and Median Crossings

CTDOT is responsible for maintaining accessibility of crosswalks and median crossings on State-owned highways. The Division of Traffic Engineering maintains an inventory of crosswalks on State highways. A goal for the next update to the Transition Plan is to update the crosswalk inventory with median information and accessibility barriers along with a program for their improvements.

As part of the VIP Program, existing crosswalks and median crossings will be reviewed for accessibility. If minor cross-slope corrections are needed to address accessibility, the work will be accomplished during repaving wherever possible. If significant regrading of an intersection is required, that will be documented for future corrective action through a new construction project.

Traffic Signals

The CTDOT's procedures and practices related to APS (accessible pedestrian signal) are addressed by the Division of Traffic Engineering's [Traffic Control Signal Design Manual](#). Similar to the CTDOT Highway Design Manual (HDM), this manual serves as the design guidance document for all traffic signal installations occurring in the State highway right-of-way regardless of whether the signal is designed by a consultant or State forces. The CTDOT's reliance on the Traffic Control Signal Design Manual ensures a consistent APS treatment at those signalized intersections.

CTDOT is updating signal design practices to no longer design side street green phasing for future designs since there is not a way to provide accessible pedestrian signal equipment.

All future designs that include proposed pedestrian phasing will be designed with exclusive or concurrent pedestrian phasing. Refer to the Appendix for more information on pedestrian phasing and introducing concurrent phasing. When exclusive or concurrent pedestrian phasing is included in the design, Accessible Pedestrian Signal (APS) equipment will be provided. Where APS equipment is provided, the sidewalk ramps will be upgraded where needed to provide accessibility from landing area to pedestrian pushbuttons.

As part of the CTDOT's ADA Transition Plan, the [Division of Traffic Engineering](#) has taken steps to evaluate and improve accessibility, as necessary, at state-maintained traffic control signals. There are over 2,500 state-maintained traffic control signals. Since there are funding, manpower, and time constraints to improve accessibility at traffic signals, priority was given to those known locations where there are existing audible buzzers that need upgrade to conform to the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices (MUTCD) and to those known locations where visually impaired pedestrians travel. CTDOT is designing and constructing APS upgrades at signalized locations in District 1, 2, 3 and 4; please see the table below for details. Typically, new accessible curb ramps are required to accommodate the APS features. Many of these locations also require the acquisition of right-of-way to install sidewalk ramps and APS equipment.

The map shows all State-maintained traffic signals. The type of pedestrian phasing is shown for each traffic signal. APS is identified for those locations with accessible pedestrian signal equipment. This information is updated as traffic signals are upgraded and the Traffic Signal Inventory database is updated.

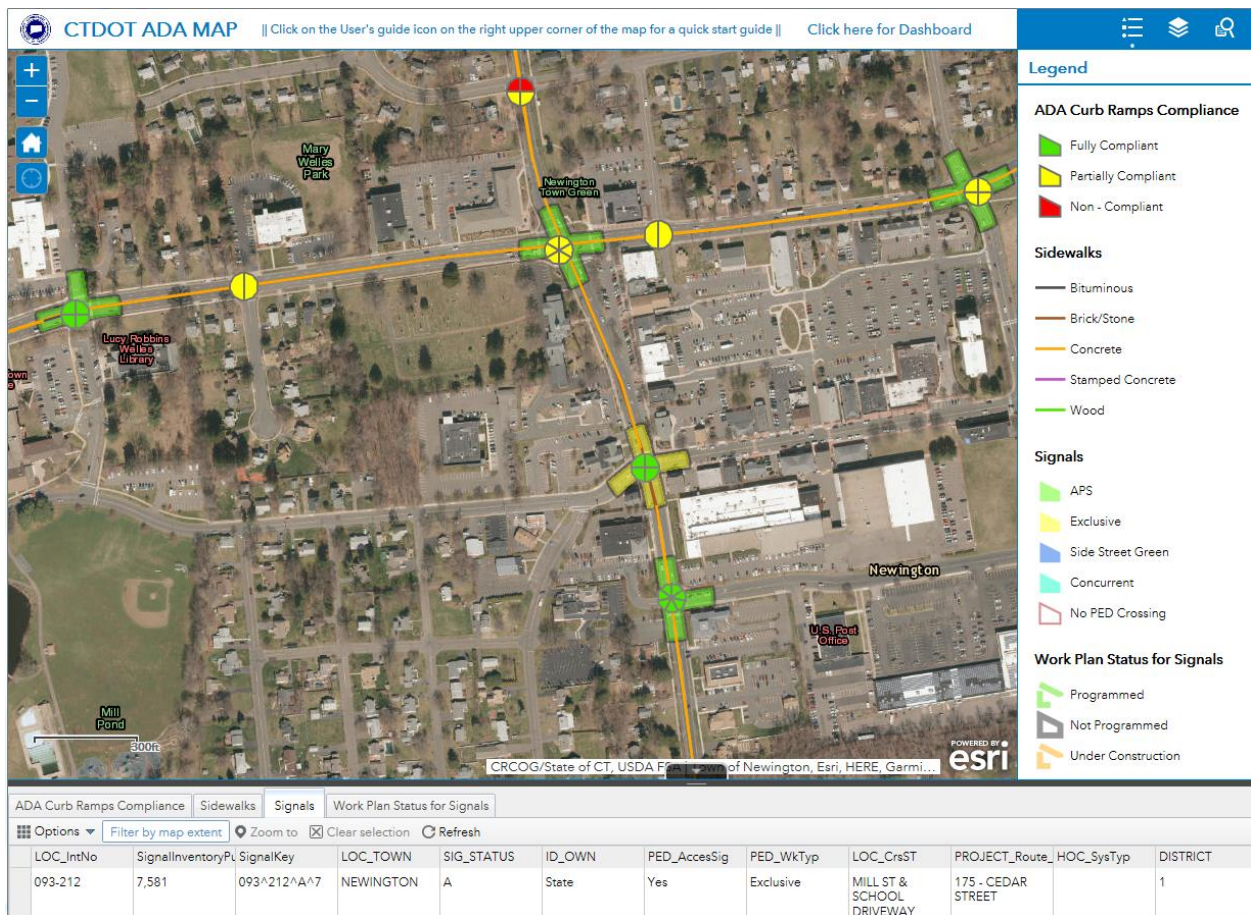


Figure 12: Sample map from CTDOT web site

- APS:** accessible pedestrian signal equipment (locator tone, vibrotactile arrow, and audible message)
- Exclusive:** vehicle traffic is stopped on all approaches for pedestrians to cross any leg of the intersection
- Concurrent:** provides a pedestrian signal indication for pedestrians to cross in the same direction at the same time as parallel vehicular traffic receives a green indication
- Side Street Green:** pedestrians cross in the same direction at the same time as the side streets receive a green indication and there is a shared signal indication for motorists and pedestrians
- No PED Crossing** – pedestrian pushbuttons and phasing are not provided; no pedestrian crossing signs are installed

On/Off-Street Parking

Off-Street:

CTDOT installs and maintains parking spaces in commuter parking lots as shown on Traffic Standard Sheet [TR-1210 09](#).

Accessible parking stalls are designed to be located and configured in accordance with ADA requirements, the Connecticut General Statutes Section 14-253a, Connecticut Building Code, Section 1106, and CTDOT Standard Sheet No. [TR-1210 09](#).

On-Street:

CTDOT does not install or maintain parking spaces or stalls (including accessible) along State highways. Towns may be permitted, via the encroachment permit process, to install and maintain parking spaces.

Reserved parking spaces on State roadways are typically parallel to sidewalks and are accessible, where possible satisfying ADA requirements. New designs are in accordance with the CTDOT Highway Design Manual.

Bus Stops/Shelters

CTDOT is currently in the process of developing a comprehensive inventory of all statewide shelters and implementing a condition assessment program that can be used to develop a capital needs program for transit amenities. This program will focus on ensuring that all Transit Shelters are ADA compliant as well as looking at existing bus stops and determining candidates for upgrading stops to include ADA compliant bus shelters.

CTDOT is also in the process of developing an inventory of bus stops within its CTtransit network of 8 divisions as well the rural transit districts, which CTDOT is a direct recipient for. This inventory will be collected in part to satisfy CTDOT Title VI requirements, but will also serve as a baseline for identifying bus stops that need investment to ensure ADA compliance. Currently CTDOT's VIP program for Highway Paving has assisted in the inventory collection of these bus stops, as well as identify the current ADA compliance of some of these existing bus stops. In cases where stops are not ADA compliant nor accessible, CTDOT and other transit districts provide complimentary paratransit service for those who are ADA eligible.

Park and Ride Lots

As a service to commuters, the state operates a network of approximately 180 Park & Ride lots. All are available to the public. Handicap parking spaces are provided. The locations of these lots can be found on the following webpage:

The Park and Ride Lots are currently being inventoried and inspected by the Bureau of Public Transportation. These inspections include monitoring of the current parking volumes, as well as the general condition of pavement, shelters, lighting, and markings.

Concurrently, the Bureau is also undergoing various capital upgrades at Park and Ride lots that provide access to CTtransit bus services. Most include repaving lots, providing/upgrading bus shelters, and restriping or expanding parking capacity.

Mixed-Use Trails

Spanning multiple decades, CTDOT, has provided oversight as well as technical and financial assistance to local municipalities as they have built out a state-wide mixed-use trail network using Federal, State, and Local funds.

With consistent CTDOT oversight, the mixed-use trail network was built to the ADA standards that were in effect at the time of each trail segment's construction. This oversight practice is on-going and is currently being applied to projects that are in design. The list of projects that have either been constructed or are being designed with State oversight and resources are included in the Appendix. Maintenance and operation for the above referenced projects lies with the local municipalities, which is documented in the individual project's funding agreements, committing the local Municipalities to the proper maintenance and operation of all transportation facilities built under the project. For future projects, the State remains committed and will ensure projects meet current ADA standards as it undertakes the design and construction of mixed-use trail projects.

Plan Monitoring

In order to ensure that CTDOT's ADA Transition Plan remains on track, it is recommended that its progress be monitored annually. This monitoring is accomplished through the Commissioner's Quarterly Civil Rights Meeting. These meetings include representation from those offices of the CTDOT responsible for planning and designing of the ADA program, the Director of the Office of Equal Opportunity and Diversity, and appropriate FHWA personnel. A report of the meetings will document CTDOT's progress and reflect any program adjustments that may be necessary.

Notable activities over the past year include:

- The ADA Transition Plan most recently was revised in July 2019. The Plan was again sent to Disability Organizations and contacts across the State requesting input, comment, and suggestions for improvement. This Plan was also posted on CTDOT's website along with a press release requesting public comment.
- ADA Transition Plan was added to the agenda of Commissioner's Quarterly Civil Rights Meeting. Positive outcome from first meeting is that each CTDOT bureau now has a designated ADA representative responsible for their activities/items on the ADA Transition Plan.
- Transportation Engineer 3 position was created to manage ADA-related public right of way issues. Position to be posted and filled by late summer.
- Hosted a teleconference with the Councils of Government to discuss an ADA/Title II requirements and to request their assistance in distributing/collecting responses from a survey sent to municipalities on this subject.
- Attended meetings with the Western CT Council of Governments (WestCOG), CT Metropolitan Council of Governments (MetroCOG), Naugatuck Valley Council of Governments (NVCOG) and Capitol Region (CRCOG) to discuss intent of ADA survey, ADA Transition Plans, and ways CTDOT could help municipalities complete their ADA Transition Plan.
- Compiled results of ADA/Title II Compliance survey. Results of the survey indicate that a number of municipalities still require support in completing their Self-Assessment and ADA Transition Plan.
- Published webmaps showing the level of accessibility for curb ramps and traffic signals, as well as presence of sidewalks in the State ROW.
- Developed and piloted a beta version of a curb ramp field inspection tool. A more robust inspection tool (to cover more items in public ROW) to be

developed by University of Connecticut as part of an overall GIS-Safety initiative.

- Issued an Engineering Directive on the use of Public Right of Way Accessibility Guidelines (PROWAG) and established a document for handling ADA Technical Infeasibility.
- Ten new and/or revised curb ramp guide sheets consistent with PROWAG were issued.
- Draft update to CTDOT Highway Design Manual for revised ADA Guidance completed and to be distributed to Highway Standards Committee for review in August.
- Draft update to CTDOT Traffic Control Signal Design Chapter 11 Pedestrian Accommodations has been completed and will be distributed for internal CTDOT review by the end of July prior to sending to the FHWA (anticipated Fall 2019).
- CTDOT has begun outreach to introduce concurrent pedestrian phasing.
- The Local Technical Assistance Program (LTAP) Center at the University of Connecticut hosted training sessions on ADA Transition Plans in May and August of 2018 for municipalities and DOT employees. CTDOT continues to work with UConn to ensure that this training is recurring and assistance is available to municipalities. The LTAP Center also assisted in scheduling two courses on curb ramp design and construction for Bureau of Highway Operations personnel involved in the curb ramp construction program.
- CTDOT continues to participate in training opportunities such as NHI Courses for Pedestrian Facility Design.

CTDOT Updating ADA/Section 504 Transition Plan

The Connecticut Department of Transportation (CTDOT) is updating its Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)/Section 504 Transition Plan and is seeking input and involvement from interested individuals and organizations of the ADA community.

Title II of the ADA prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability for State and Local Government Services, and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 prohibits discrimination against people with disabilities in programs that receive federal financial assistance.

Having completed a review of current policies and procedures regarding employment practices, communications, facilities and accessibility at intersections along state-owned roads, the CTDOT is posting the current draft of the ADA/504 Transition Plan on our website for those wishing to review and comment.

"This project is the result of extensive collaboration from the last several years among CTDOT, stakeholders, partners and interested parties," said CTDOT Commissioner Joe Giulietti. "This Plan establishes a baseline and guidance for accessibility to Connecticut's transportation system with the goal of making transportation accessible to all users who travel throughout our great state."

The Department of Transportation (Department) is asking your help in engaging your member municipalities in an assessment of municipal compliance with the ADA. The ADA requires all state and local governments to provide access to their facilities, programs and services for persons with disabilities. Title II of the ADA also requires that all state and local governments conduct a self-evaluation of the accessibility of their facilities, programs, and services. These self-assessments are an important way to ensure that Title II's requirements are being met. They also enable local governments to pinpoint the facilities, programs, and services that must be modified or relocated to ensure that local governments are complying with the ADA.


Full compliance with the ADA requires that that state and local governments with 50 or more employees prepare a formal ADA Transition Plan with the four elements below.

- Identification of the official responsible for implementation of the transition plan (See 28 CFR 35.150(d)(3)(iv));
- An inventory of barriers (i.e., identification of physical obstacles) (See 28 CFR 35.150(d)(3)(i) & 28 CFR 35.150(a));
- A prioritized schedule of when barriers will be eliminated and deficiencies corrected (See 28 CFR 35.150(d)(2) & 28 CFR 25.150(d)(3)(iii)); and
- A description of the methods that will be used to make facilities accessible (See 28 CFR 35.150(d)(3)(ii)).

The Department is requesting your assistance in helping us determine the level of ADA compliance of your member towns. We want to be clear that we are not asking each municipality to prepare an ADA Transition Plan, but rather that each municipality assess its level of compliance with the ADA. Please work with your member towns to complete the attached short self-assessment questionnaire. We ask that you compile the responses and return them to us by January 4, 2019.

We will schedule a teleconference within the next two weeks to provide additional information about the ADA requirements, and answer any questions you have about this request. The Department is going through the process now of preparing its own ADA Transition Plan, and we understand that this request will generate many questions from your municipalities about what facilities and assets must be inventoried and the level of detail required for the inventory.

Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Curb Ramp Requirements during Resurfacing Projects

BACKGROUND

The Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) is a civil rights statute prohibiting discrimination against persons with disabilities in all aspects of life, including transportation, based on regulations promulgated by the United States Department of Justice (DOJ). DOJ's regulations require accessible planning, design, and construction to integrate people with disabilities into mainstream society. Further, these laws require that public entities responsible for operating and maintaining the public rights-of-way do not discriminate in their programs and activities against persons with disabilities. FHWA's Civil Rights program implements the DOJ regulations through delegated authority to ensure that pedestrians with disabilities have the opportunity to use the transportation system's pedestrian facilities in an accessible and safe manner.

FHWA and DOJ met in March 2012 and March 2013 to clarify guidance on the ADA's requirements for constructing curb ramps on resurfacing projects. Projects deemed to be alterations must include curb ramps within the scope of the project.

SUMMARY OF GUIDANCE CLARIFICATION

This clarification provides a single Federal policy that identifies specific asphalt and concrete-pavement repair treatments that are considered to be alterations - requiring Installation of curb ramps within the scope of the project - and those that are considered to be maintenance, which do not require curb ramps at the time of the improvement.

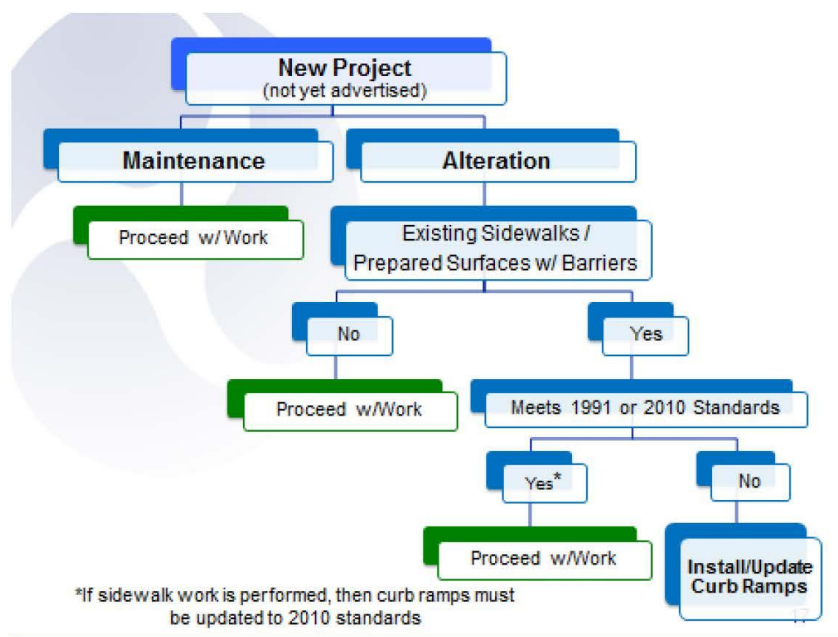

This approach clearly identifies the types of structural treatments that both DOJ and FHWA agree require curb ramps (when there is a pedestrian walkway with a prepared surface for pedestrian use and a curb, elevation, or other barrier between the street and the walkway) and furthers the goal of the ADA to provide increased accessibility to the public right-of-way for persons with disabilities. This single Federal policy will provide for increased consistency and improved enforcement.

PROJECT SELECTION PROCESS:



ADA TRANSITION PLANS

Title II of the ADA requires all public organizations with 50 or more employees to adopt a Transition Plan identifying physical obstacles limiting access to programs, services and activities by persons with qualified disabilities and bring related deficiencies into compliance with the ADA.

Basic components of an ADA transition plan include:

- ✓ Designate an ADA Coordinator
- ✓ Development & postings of an ADA Policy Statement
- ✓ Development & postings of Grievance Procedures/Complaint Procedures
- ✓ Complete a self-evaluation
- ✓ Development of a Transition Plan

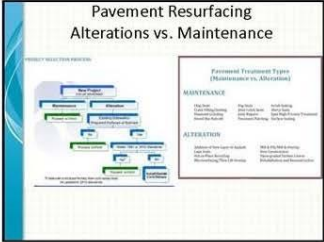

- 48" clear width min. – measured from back of the curb

- May follow general grade of roadway
- Supported slopes (structures and approaches) must meet ramp requirements (max. slope, landings, handrails, etc.) if >5% slope

The Department appreciates the time you spent reviewing our ADA Transition Plan and offer the following response to the comments you have offered:

- In response to accessibility of the online ADA/504 complaint form, CTDOT will take your comments into consideration as we plan to revise and improve the format of this form. We will consider your suggestions on using plain text as an alternative, using underlines, or possibly using a fillable PDF instead of a Word document if that will resolve some of the issues, in an effort to ensure it is easier to use with a screen-reader.
- In response to the design of curb ramps and placement of APS pushbuttons, we recognize that some existing pedestrian facilities are less than desirable. The Department has recently issued new design standards for curb ramps that should result in improved accessibility for all disabled individuals. We are also working on an update to the Highway Design Manual to improve design guidance and to incorporate criteria from the Public Right of Way Accessibility Guidelines (PROWAG). It will take time to complete, however, The Department is making progress in removing accessibility barriers in the public right of way.
- In response to pavement conditions at pedestrian crossings. As we have incorporated curb-ramps improvements as part of our resurfacing program, our Highway Operations Bureau has become more aware of accessibility issues caused by poor pavement conditions at pedestrian crossings and should be addressing them as situations arise. Please feel free to contact our District Maintenance offices should you become aware of an issue.

Thank for taking the time to review our ADA Transition Plan. CTDOT recognizes the importance of improving accessibility and has recently adopted the Pedestrian Right of Way Accessibility Guidelines (PROWAG) and will use it in the design of all new projects. Prior to adopting PROWAG, CTDOT followed the ADA Accessibility Guidelines (ADAAG) as they applied to the public right of way. It is unfortunate that accessibility issues were experienced on the Route 4 project in Farmington during construction. Those involved in the design and construction of the project were aware of the needs of the stakeholders in the area, however some ancillary work performed by a utility company unrelated to the project and the project's contractor did not consistently meet all the accessibility requirements. The project team had the contractor resolve these issues and continues to work closely with the contractor to insure there are no future problems.

CTDOT has recently established a position that is tasked specifically with dealing with accessibility issues in the public right of way. Insuring that CTDOT staff, as well as others who work in our right of way, are properly trained on accessibility issues during design and construction will hopefully mitigate any future problems like the ones experienced.

On p. 14 of DOT's Draft Transition Plan, ADA/ Section 504, Revised July, 2019 it says in the second paragraph: **"Any entity (CTDOT, Municipality, Private Developer/Permittee) which undertakes an alteration in the State Right of Way (ROW) must address any permanent and temporary accessibility barriers impacted by the improvement (emphasis added)."**

The Citizens Coalition For Equal Access, a small grassroots disability advocacy organization, would like to recommend that this section be changed to require the provision of PROWAG training for CTDOT, Municipality, and Private Developer/Permittee staff people who would be involved in the construction of “any permanent and temporary accessibility barriers.”

Our recommendation is based on the recent experience of many Citizens Coalition members who live at New Horizons Village in Unionville and who have had to negotiate the pedestrian barriers created by the construction work at the intersection of Route 177 and New Britain and Railroad Avenues in Unionville Center. Despite an excellent 2018 meeting at New Horizons Village with representatives of the DOT and the Town of Farmington, at which there were numerous assurances of safe pedestrian passage during the construction period, the actual experience has been anything but.

Two members’ wheelchairs have gotten stuck in the tar put down to create a temporary sidewalk surface for pedestrian passage. In addition, at times during the construction, there has been no option for wheelchair pedestrians other than to go out into the street.

Finally, I am attaching photographs taken on August 14th that show two more problems.

In the first two photos, the righthand and lefthand legs respectively of the temporary signs violates the PROWAG requirement of 4 feet of clearance in the Right-of-Way. This situation has occurred several times throughout the construction period, and it is clear that workers need training to think about the placement of signs and its impact on people using wheelchairs.

In the second photo, it is totally unclear where the pedestrian detour is, ESPECIALLY for people in wheelchairs, who aren’t even represented by an icon on the Detour sign.

POLICY NO. EX.O.-17

February 27, 2019

SUBJECT: Americans with Disabilities Policy

It is the policy of the Connecticut Department of Transportation (Department) not to discriminate against qualified individuals with disabilities in any of its employment practices, programs, services, or activities, and, accordingly, to comply with the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990, as amended, and Connecticut General Statutes § 46a-60.

Under the ADA, an individual with a disability is any person who (1) has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities; (2) has a record of such impairment; or (3) is regarded as having such impairment.

Reasonable Accommodations

The Department will reasonably accommodate the known physical or mental limitations of an otherwise qualified individual with a disability, unless the accommodation would impose an undue burden. The Department will make every reasonable effort to determine and provide the appropriate reasonable accommodation to a qualified individual upon request. The Department, in its discretion, may require the individual to provide additional information about his or her disability or limitations and the need for an accommodation. The ADA does not require the Department to take any action that would fundamentally alter the nature of its programs or services, or impose an undue financial or administrative burden.

Reasonable Accommodation Process

1. If a qualified applicant or employee wants to request an accommodation, adjustment or change at work for a reason related to disability (taken together, "accommodation"), the employee or his or her representative (e.g., family member, friend, or health professional acting on behalf of the employee) must inform the employee's Supervisor, Manager or the Human Resources Administrator. To request an accommodation, the employee may use "plain English" and need not mention the ADA or use the phrase "reasonable accommodation". The employee need not

disclose the medical condition to the Supervisor or Manager when requesting an accommodation; however, the medical condition is to be disclosed to the Office of Human Resources at the appropriate stage of the requesting process. Once aware of a situation that may be the result of a medical condition that could qualify under ADA, the Supervisor, Manager, or Human Resources Administrator should present the employee with a copy of the Department's ADA Policy and Request for Accommodation Form to initiate the formal process.

2. The request for an accommodation triggers the start of what is known as the "interactive process" between the qualified employee and the Department. The interactive process is informal, with the employee and the Department acting in good faith, to identify the precise limitations resulting from the disability and potential reasonable accommodations that could overcome those limitations.
3. Any qualified employee or his or her representative may request a reasonable accommodation for such employee with a disability by completing the form entitled "Employee Request for Accommodation Under the Americans with Disabilities Act and the Connecticut General Statutes" (Form) (see attached), along with a copy of the job specification for the position for which the employee is seeking accommodation.
4. Submission of the Form to the Employee's Supervisor or Manager initiates a review by the Supervisor or Manager of the essential functions of the job to determine the operational impact, if any, of the request. The Supervisor or Manager may discuss the request with the employee to clarify what is being requested and needed. The employee does not have to disclose confidential medical information to the Supervisor or Manager. The Manager should also confer with the Office of Human Resources regarding the reasonableness of the accommodation request. The Supervisor or Manager will complete the operational impact statement section and forward the form to the Director of Human Resources. The Human Resources designee will contact the employee to continue the interactive process and ask the employee to complete the top section of the second page of the Form, provide associated medical certification, propose any accommodation and provide any cost estimates, etc.
5. The Human Resources Administrator will review the Form, the attachments and information from the interactive process discussions to make the decision to approve or deny the request on behalf of the Department. In the event of a denial, an appeal of the decision may be made, in writing, to the Office of Equal Opportunity and Diversity, P.O. Box 317546, 2800 Berlin Turnpike, Room 2225, Newington, CT 06131.

Qualified individuals with a disability who require an auxiliary aid or service for effective communication, or a modification of policies or procedures to participate in a program, service or activity, should contact the Human Resources Administrator at (860) 594-3100 for assistance in coordinating the requested accommodation.

Mr. Eric Smith, Equal Employment Opportunity Director, is responsible for all Department Affirmative Action activities and investigations of discrimination complaints pursuant to the federal and State laws listed in the Affirmative Action Policy Statement. The Department's Affirmative Action Discrimination Complaint Procedure also applies to alleged violations of the ADA. POLICY NO. E&C -19
February 2, 2011

SUBJECT: Sidewalks

1. Sidewalk Already Exists

When a roadway is to be reconstructed, and the project will disturb an existing sidewalk, the reconstruction of the sidewalk will be included in the reconstruction project.

2. Sidewalk Does Not Currently Exist

a. State Roads and Bridges

When a roadway is to be constructed or reconstructed, when deciding on the inclusion of new sidewalks, the extent and patterns of pedestrian travel demand should be considered, as well as other factors such as project scope, costs and associated impacts. Pedestrian accommodation should be evaluated by means of a pedestrian travel assessment, while also taking into account public comment. The assessment may consider, but not be limited to, the existing or planned pedestrian facilities in the project area; a review of the Town Sidewalk Plan if one exists; whether the road facility is a potential barrier to pedestrian travel or if there are alternative paths or crossings available; pedestrian accidents; existing or planned significant destinations in the area, such as residential areas, schools, employment centers, shopping centers, businesses, public transportation facilities; recreation areas, etc. If the Department determines that it is prudent and feasible to include new sidewalks, then sidewalks may be included within the limits of the project or extending to a logical terminus point.

b. Local Roads Adjusted As Part of a State Highway Project

When an improvement is being made to a local road, sidewalk improvements may be included within the limits of the project, or to a logical nearby terminus point, if the Department determines they are prudent and feasible following the assessment procedure outlined in Section 2a.

Sidewalks beyond the limits of the project or logical nearby terminus point may be constructed as part of the project if the local community will enter into an agreement to provide the financial resources for the full cost of the design and construction, including associated rights-of-way and utility costs of such sidewalk.

3. Exclusive Sidewalk Projects

Exclusive sidewalk projects, to include the construction of new sidewalks along a State Highway, will be considered where a need is demonstrated following the assessment procedure outlined in Section 2a.

Exclusive sidewalk projects, to include the construction of new sidewalks along a local roadway, will be considered where a need is demonstrated following the assessment procedure outlined in Section 2a and in accordance with the latest STP-Urban Pavement Rehabilitation/Sidewalk Guidelines.


4. Liability, Maintenance and Repair Responsibilities

The municipality in which the sidewalks are located will be required to enter into an agreement with the State in perpetuity, clearly stating that the municipality is fully responsible for all liability, maintenance, repairs, and snow and ice removal for any new sidewalks constructed under the provisions of this policy, with the exception that the State will be responsible for liability, maintenance, repairs, and snow and ice removal of sidewalks on State maintained bridges and their approaches, consistent with Connecticut General Statute 13a-91. The responsibility for liability, maintenance, repair, and snow and ice removal of existing sidewalks which are reconstructed will remain as was prior to the reconstruction work.

5. Cost Participation

The federal/state/municipal cost participation for sidewalks will be consistent with the overall project's funding participation requirements, except as outlined in Section 2b. Sidewalks will be constructed with concrete, unless the municipality requests an alternate material. If the municipality requests an alternate material more expensive than concrete, the municipality will be responsible for the difference in cost, except in the case of reconstruction of an existing sidewalk constructed of that material.

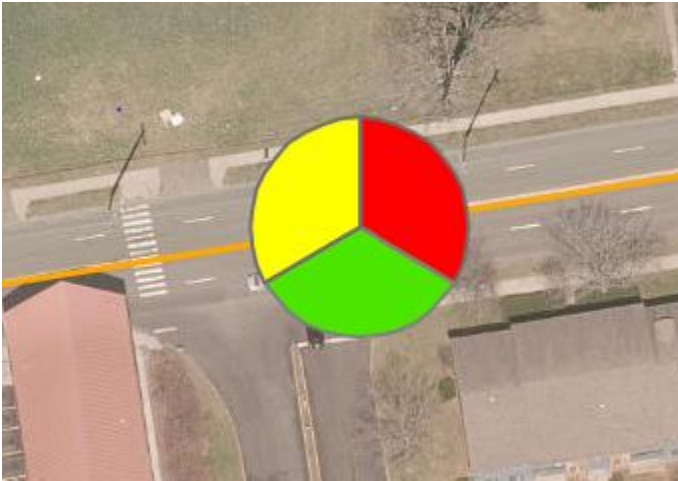

Section 6: Curb Ramp Details on ADA Webmap

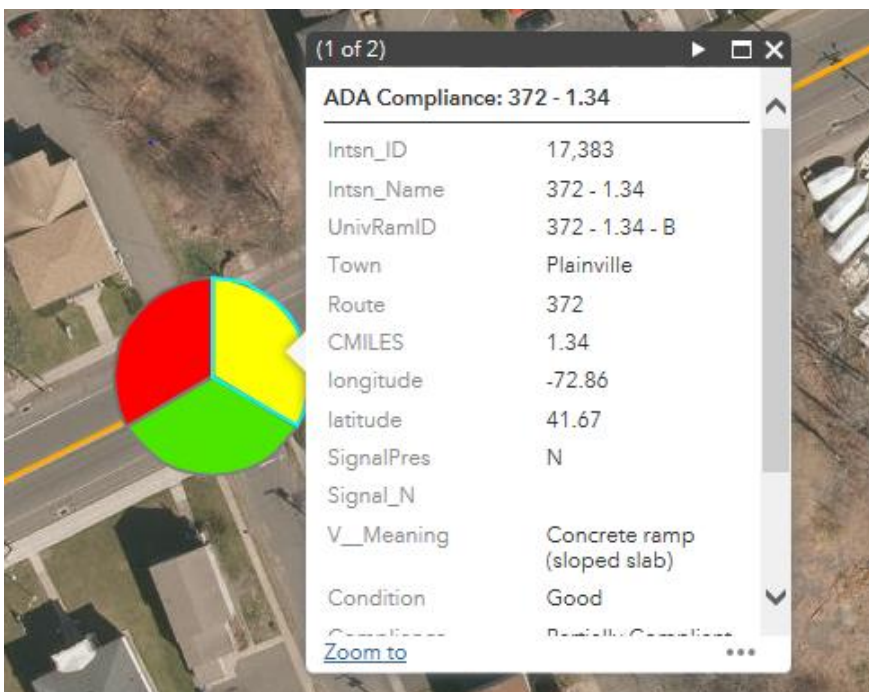
Definition of Curb Ramp Pie Chart



The CTDOT ADA Map indicates location(s) where curb ramps exist or are required for ADA compliance using colored pie.

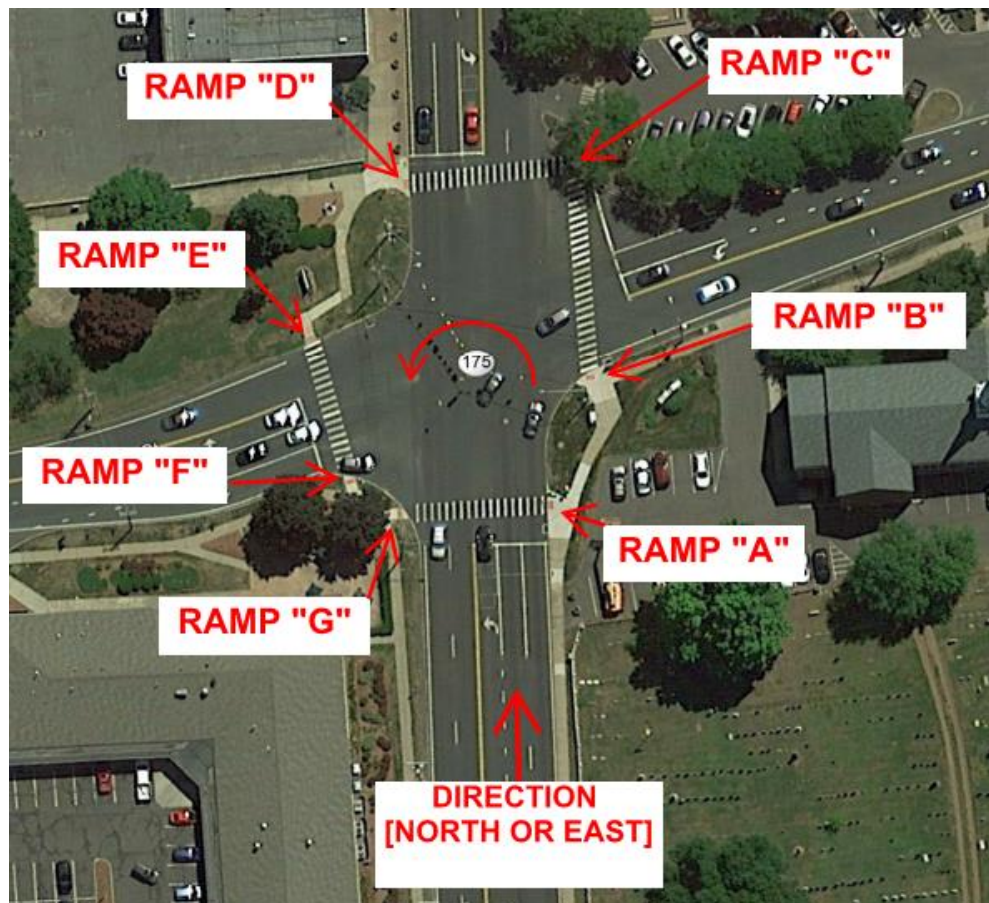
Each pie slice represents one ramp present. The total number of ramps present equals the sum of the colored pie slices, at the designated location.

The pie slice's color represents level of ADA compliance [Green for Fully Compliant, Yellow for Partially Compliant and Red for Non-Compliant].



Detailed curb ramp information (shown above) is available by clicking on the individual pie slice. A pop up box will appear stating the individual curb ramp's location, composition, and level of compliance, etc. at that location.

For individual ramp location, the string information corresponding to the “UnivRAMID” indicates individual ramp’s location. This location ID format **UnivRamID 372 – 1.34 –B** indicates the “State Route No – Route Inventory Milepoint – Ramp Letter”. The route inventory milepoint represents a point, defined by the CTDOT, where another road intersects the state route. The “Ramp Letter” (A,B,C,etc.) designation identifies the individual ramp at the intersection. The ramp letter is assigned by the first curb ramp encountered approaching the intersection from the northbound or eastbound direction of travel. Subsequent ramps at the intersection are assigned a letter in alphabetical order going counter clockwise around the intersection layout. See example below.



Opportunity

Work towards Concurrent pedestrian phasing to replace Side Street Green, where applicable.

This will provide the following for pedestrians:

- Countdown pedestrian indications (with Walk/Don't Walk)
- Push buttons with Accessible Pedestrian Signals (APS)
- Leading Pedestrian Intervals (LPI), where possible
- ADA compliant ramps
- Crosswalks

Challenges

- Exclusive and Concurrent Pedestrian Phasing use the same Walk/Don't Walk and Countdown indications
- Longstanding practice has likely trained Connecticut residents to assume all traffic STOPS when Walk/Don't Walk indications are present
- Concern with violating expectations of pedestrians and motorists who are accustomed to exclusive walk phases

Potential Approach

- Signs to alert drivers 
- Sign for pedestrians 
- Percussive Tone vs. Speech Message
- Community education

The Department is currently pursuing concurrent pedestrian phasing at various locations under State projects.

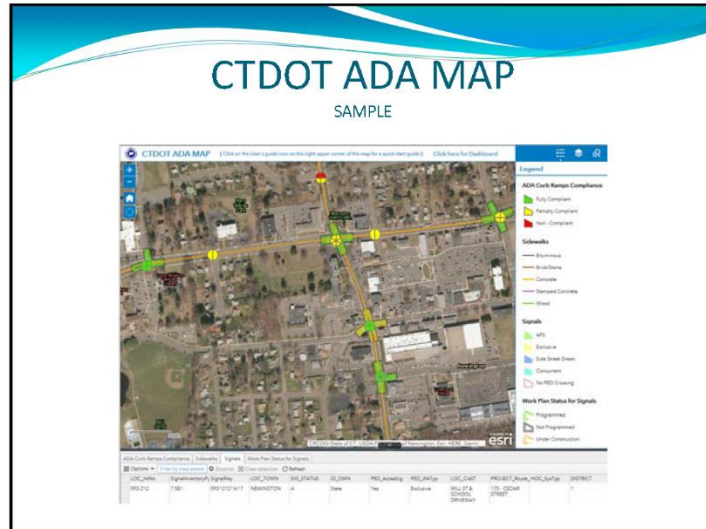
