

Sign Up Now for Telegenetics Training March 15th or 31st, 2022, 12:00-4:00pm

Telegenetics is increasingly used to connect underserved populations with genetic care and services. The telegenetics training course offered by **Western States Regional Genetics Network** can help you improve your skills, give you some ideas for new technology and platforms, and provide information about policies, laws, and practice, during and after the COVID-19 pandemic.



The entirely-virtual course, available at **no cost**, consists of:

- Ten self-paced on-line modules (~3-4 hours total)
- A mandatory four-hour, live Zoom training with telegenetics experts on March 15th or March 31st, 12:00 – 4:00 pm EST

Free CEUs are available for certified genetic counselors practicing in New England (costs covered by the New England Regional Genetics Network). Approximately 1 CEU will be awarded (NSGC approval pending). CEUs are only available to first-time participants.

- CEUs (if applicable) and a Certificate of Completion will be provided to participants who complete the online content AND attend **one** of the two live (virtual) events
- Genetics and non-genetics providers and students are welcome to attend. Space is limited, and preference will be given to first-time participants practicing in the New England region.
- Participants must agree to answer a short survey each year about their telehealth experiences. This helps the trainers to offer the course as part of their federal funding.
- Registration and modules will open two weeks before the training.
