Dear Pharmacist

In accordance with Connecticut General Statute: Section 21a-254 – The Connecticut Department of Consumer Protection has established a program to monitor the prescribing and dispensing of Schedule II, III, IV & V controlled substances. This **mandatory program** was designed to provide information regarding the prescription of controlled substances in order to prevent the improper or illegal use of the controlled substance and shall not infringe on the legitimate prescribing of a controlled substance by a prescribing practitioner acting in good faith and in the course of professional practice. The program will cover the entire state. All transactions must be submitted at least twice monthly.

This letter serves as official notification of your user name, password, website and instructions for reporting prescription data to the CPMRS Data Reporting Program. Please contact your corporate office for details if you are part of a large chain. Please review the enclosed reporting manual.

THE PROGRAM IMPLEMENTATION SCHEDULE

Initial Reporting Period:	July 1-15, 2008
Initial Reporting Deadline:	July 25, 2008

The deadline for reporting dispensing between the 1^{st} and 15^{th} of each month is the 25^{th} of that month. The deadline for reporting dispensing between the 16^{th} and the last day of the month is the 10^{th} of the next month. Dispensers are encouraged to report prior to the deadline in order to have time to correct any rejected submissions.

NOTE: Dispensers may report on a more frequent basis but must report at least twice monthly.
