The meeting was called to order at 8:34 a.m. by Chairperson Brandon.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

John made a motion to accept the minutes from the September 24, 2014 meeting, Christine seconded, all were in favor.

REINSTATEMENTS

The Board received two reinstatement applications to consider.

Jennifer Horan, SHR.448

Susan Gieras, SHR.437

Both reporters had been inactive from reporting since 2010. The Board felt that due to the length of inactivity, both should re-test. The Board ruled that Jennifer Horan and Susan Gieras cannot reinstate, and that they must retest and reapply as new applicants.

OLD BUSINESS

Patricia distributed her draft of the wording for a clarification of CEUs for Connecticut LSRs. Tracy questioned the final paragraph regarding Professional Development Credits (PDCs). After a brief discussion, the Board decided to limit the number of PDCs to 10 per cycle. Patricia will put the document into a final format and get it to John. John will forward the document to the Connecticut Court Reporters Association.

NEW BUSINESS

Patricia mentioned that NCRA has modified their reinstatement rules to allow an RPR to reinstate after being inactive for up to seven years. Although the Board felt that was extreme, the rigors of attaining an RPR designation may warrant such a time span.

Christine asked for the Board's opinion on the acceptability of digital signatures from e-transcripts. The Board felt that digital signatures are becoming more commonplace, and did not see an issue with their acceptance.
