CT Coalition for Sustainable Materials Management,

We would like to propose our New Meadow Power and Earth project, with its location at 1183 Oronoque Road, Milford, as an organics development and siting of infrastructure opportunity for anaerobic digestion and composting of food residuals. The project has participated in numerous clean energy solicitations and food recycling discussions over the last half dozen years. Its sister company owned site is an approximately twenty acre industrial zoned parcel, in a utility infrastructure area of densely populated coastal southwest Connecticut, has excellent availability of distribution and transmission electricity and gas, is adjacent to a municipal wastewater treatment plant, is down the road from a municipal solid waste transfer station, is across from rail, and has good truck transportation access (approximately one mile from I-95). The site has established leaf composting, clean wood recycling, engineered soil and other operations, and has a history of industrial recycling activities for at least the last fifty years.
