

COVID -19 Updates



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Executive Orders

- Executive Order No. 22-1 (03/30/2022)
 - -Repeals Governor Malloy's Executive Order No. 52 regarding state-funded travel to North Carolina.
- Executive Order No. 14F (01/19/2022)
 - -Proof of vaccination booster or testing for nursing home visitors and primary and secondary essential support persons.
- **Executive Order No. 14E** (01/11/2022)
 - -Reemployment of retired teachers to help address teacher shortage.
- Executive Order No. 14D (01/07/2022)
 - -Flexibility to provide for adequate healthcare resources and facilities; Practice before licensure for certain healthcare profession applicants and graduates; Temporary permits for certain healthcare providers extended; Participation in resident physician assistant program prior to permit issuance; Temporary suspension of physician assistant supervision restrictions; Temporary suspension of in-person supervision requirement for advanced practice registered nurses; and No employer charge for sequestration expenses.
- **Executive Order No. 14C** (01/06/2022)
 - -COVID-19 vaccination booster requirement for employees of state hospitals.

 - Standard review time 30-60 days include DPH review time in your project schedule, could be longer depending on workloads





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UCMR4 DATA REVIEW

- 47 systems tested at entry points and in distribution systems
- 8985 individual results reviewed
- Eight Pesticides and one Pesticide Manufacturing Byproduct
 - No Detections
- Three Alcohols
 - One detection each of 1-butanol and 2-methoxyethanol
 - Both detections are orders of magnitude below the Health Reference Level (HRL) of 700 μg/l and 21 μg/l respectively
- Three other Semi-volatile Organic Compounds
 - No Detections

Contaminants and Drinking Water Quality



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UCMR4 DATA REVIEW

- Ten Cyanotoxin Chemical Contaminants
 - One detection of anatoxin-a
 - Orders of magnitude below the HRL of 3.5 μg/l
 - Indicates a broader issue in the source water and watershed that warrants further investigation
- Two Metals
 - Germanium-not detected
 - Manganese
 - 249 total detections
 - Levels range from ND to 2280 μg/l
 - Seven sample points exceed the HRL of 300 μg/l
 - Provide tools for customer notification

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UCMR4 DATA REVIEW

- Three Brominated Haloacetic Acid groups-Distribution system monitoring
 - HAA5, HAA6Br and HAA9
 - Detected together in 748 sample events
 - Associated with Surface Water, Ground Water and Mixed systems
 - Additional data review to come

 - **♦ LSL Replacement**
 - **♦** Compliance tap sampling
 - **♦** Action and trigger levels
 - **Underserved communities**

Operator Certification Program



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COVID-19 Suspension of Certification Renewal:

- 3/10/20 Governor Lamont: issued a <u>Declaration of Public Health and Civil Preparedness Emergencies</u> (Declaration),
- 3/30/20 CT DPH Commissioner's order, the requirement to renew was suspended,

All impacted certifications have an 8/15/22 expiration date – if not renewed by this date you certification "shall expire",

Operators, with a Suspended Renewal should note the following:

- While this renewal cycle (COVID-19) has been extended, the next cycle will be shortened by an equivalent amount,
- This means that operators will have less time to accumulate the require training contact hours in their next renewal cycle,
- Operator should begin to prepare for the submission of their renewal application,
- Operators shouldn't wait to 8/15/2022 to renew their certification,

Tracking per State Drought Plan



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



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DWSRF Update



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- **►EPA** issued Implementation Guidance on funding from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law on March 8, 2022 along with a BIL Fact Sheet (DWS Circular Letter #2022-17)
- ➤ The SFY 2023 Call for Projects deadline was March 31, 2022 and DPH received 78 applications for funding totaling \$418 million
- ➤DPH is working on updating the following to address and/or comply with EPA's BIL Implementation Guidance
 - **→** Priority Ranking System
 - **▶** Disadvantaged Community Assistance Program
- >OMB has not yet issued any guidance on:
 - **▶** Buy America Build America (BABA) requirements that kick in on May 14, 2022
 - > Justice 40 requirements

DWSRF Funding from the BIL



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	SFY 2023/FFY 2022	5 Year Total
Supplemental Capitalization Award	\$17,955,000	\$116,065,000
Lead Service Line Replacement Award	\$28,275,000	\$141,375,000
PFAS/Emerging Contaminants Award	\$7,540,000	\$37,700,000
Total	\$53,770,000	\$295,140,000



Supplemental DWSRF Capitalization Award



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- ➤ May be used for any eligible DWSRF project under Base DWSRF Program
- >\$8,817,550 of the award must be used by the state to subsidize loans for drinking water infrastructure projects in disadvantaged communities only
- > Eligible projects are the same as for the base DWSRF



Lead Service Line Replacement Award



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- > \$28,275,000 in SFY 2023
- > Funding can only be used for the LSLR projects
- ➤ Funding may be used to complete LSL inventory requirement under the new Lead and Copper Rule Revisions
- ➤ Both utility-owned portion and customer-owned portion of LSL must be replaced (no partial replacements)
- > \$13,854,750 must be used by the state to subsidize loans for LSLR projects in disadvantaged communities only



PFAS/Emerging Contaminants Award



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- > \$7,540,000 for SFY 2023/FFY 2022
- Primary focus is to address per-fluoroakyl and poly-fluoroalkyl substances (PFAS)
- ➤ Other eligible emerging contaminants include those on the 5 EPA Contaminant Candidate Lists
 - ➤ If it falls under the National Primary Drinking Water Regulations (i.e. has an MCL), it is not eligible for this pot of funds (except for PFAS)
- ➤ All of these funds must be used by the state to subsidize loans for PFAS or other emerging contaminant projects minimum of 25% must be used for small systems (<25,000 population) or disadvantaged communities
