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Executive Orders

- Executive Order No. 21-3 (12/16/2021)
 - Actions to reduce carbon emissions and prepare for the impacts of the climate crisis.
- Executive Order No. 14B (01/06/2022)
 - -COVID-19 vaccination booster requirement for employees of long-term care facilities.
- Executive Order No. 14C (01/06/2022)
 - -COVID-19 vaccination booster requirement for employees of state hospitals.
- Executive Order No. 14D (01/07/2022)
 - -Flexibility to provide for adequate healthcare resources and facilities; Practice before licensure for certain healthcare profession applicants and graduates; Temporary permits for certain healthcare providers extended; Participation in resident physician assistant program prior to permit issuance; Temporary suspension of physician assistant supervision restrictions; Temporary suspension of in-person supervision requirement for advanced practice registered nurses; and No employer charge for sequestration expenses.
- Executive Order No. 14E (01/11/2022)
 - -Reemployment of retired teachers to help address teacher shortage.

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UCMR5-Final Rule Published on December 27, 2021

- 29 PFAS plus lithium
- Systems serving more than 10,000 people
- Systems serving 3,300 to 10,000 people subject to availability of appropriations and sufficient laboratory capacity
- Representative sample of small systems (800 nationwide)

- 5) Tap sampling protocol to individuals collecting samples
- 6) List of schools and childcare facilities served by the water system

Operator Certification Program



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COVID-19 Suspension of Certification Renewal:

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic Governor Lamont on 3/10/20 issued a **Declaration of Public Health and Civil Preparedness Emergencies** (Declaration).

As a result of the CT DPH Commissioner's 3/30/20 order, water operator renewal requirements are suspended ("Suspended Renewal") for those certifications due to expire during the Declaration.

Operators, with a Suspended Renewal should note the following:

- This means that operators will have less time to accumulate the require training contact hours in their next renewal cycle,
- It is therefore advantageous to renew sooner than later, **Operator should begin to prepare for the reinstatement of renewal requirements**,
- Operators don't have to wait to the end of the Declaration to renew their certification,
- Operators may request their renewal application via email send email request to dph.opcert@ct.gov

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Proficiency Tests Due July 31st, 2022

- The drinking water regulations require laboratories to analyze a Proficiency Test (PT) sample for each drinking water method that a laboratory performs and for which a PT is commercially available
- The 80% rule applies to methods for each matrix that at least 5 analytes are analyzed.

Method and Analyte(s)	PT ACCEPTABLE REQUIREMENT
Vinyl Chloride 524	100%
VOCs 524	80%*
ТНМ	100%
VOC 624, 8260	80%*
HAA5	80%*
Semi-VOC 525, 625	80%*







DWSRF Update



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- SFY 2022 Intended Use Plan was finalized on January 4, 2022
- Circular Letter 2022-03 is being issued today for information on the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) which will provide approximately \$53.8 million in drinking water infrastructure funding through the DWSRF Program for FY 2022:
 - \$18 million for any eligible DWSRF project
 - \$28.3 million for lead service line replacements
 - \$7.5 million for emerging contaminants with a focus of PFAS/PFOA
- The BIL also authorizes similar appropriations for FY's 2023-2026 and reauthorizes annual appropriations for the DWSRF at levels between \$2.4 \$3.25 billion nationally from 2022-2025 (4 years)
- Applications for DWSRF/BIL funding during SFY 2023 are expected to be announced early in 2022 during our annual DWSRF Call for Projects.
