## **DPH Update**

- 5. (Jeff) 3 Major topics. First, Tri-annual EPA inspection/audit, DPH passed with no deviations, State Lab passed.
- 6. (Jeff) Second Major Topic, Pharmaceuticals in Drinking Water (Based on concern generated by recent AP report). The EPA is doing more research. Several new methods approved in Dec. 2007.
- 7. (Greg) What about the issue of MDL's?
- 8. (Dr.Xie) Need more expensive equipment to find lower levels.
- 9. (Bert) Connecticut protects its drinking watersheds.
- 10. (Jeff) In CT, no discharges into drinking water sources.
- 11. (Bert) Similar concerns in Farmington River about sterile fish as a result of pharmaceuticals, other low levels wastes.
- 12. (Jeff) AP article- too many female fish?
- 13. (Kim) AP article is nothing new on the waste water side, where work has been going on for five years. New law passed last year banning the flushing of prescription drugs down the toilet.
- 14. (Jeff) This is a problem for nursing homes on septic systems.
- 15. (Donna) Northeast has tested for caffeine as an indicator.
- 16. (Jeff) Largest levels should be OTC drugs and birth control.

17. (Jeff) Third Major Topic, Legislation Pending About Toxic Toys, mainly concerning lead and phthalates. "Toxic" not defined yet, but something may be passed soon.
