' 1. Linicoln Technical Institute (LTI):

LTI is requesting approval of the appointment of **Sara Johnson, MSN, RN** as the Regional Director of Nursing (Program Administrator) position as of 01/03/2022. Ms. Johnson earned a Bachelor of Science in Nursing in May 1982 and a Master of Science in Nursing, Nursing Education in May 1994 both from Southern CT State University. 3. Three Rivers Community College (TRCC):

Her workload will be solely administrative without teaching responsibilities. Narrative: Yes, this is an interim appointment due to the unexpected mid-year retirement of the previous Director. The search for a permanent director will begin in Spring 2022 with an anticipated timeline for appointment of August 2022.

Provide a brief summary of the events leading to the appointment of a new nurse administrator.

Narrative: After the unexpected mid-year retirement of the current Director of Nursing Dr. Edith Ouellet, Dr. Arpin met with Academic Dean Kem Barfield to discuss the immediate and future needs of the nursing program. Strategies to continue with the least amount of disruption to students and faculty was discussed. Dr. Arpin, having served as fulltime faculty for 8 years at TRCC, and having held the role of Course Coordinator for 3 of those years, possessed the skill set desired for the position. Dr. Arpin accepted the position of Interim Division Director of Nursing and Allied Health pending BOEN approval and began planning the transition with the outgoing Director, Dr. Edith Ouellet.

Describe the mentoring/orientation plan for the new nurse administrator.

Narrative: The current and out-going Division Director of Nursing and Allied Health overlaps the transition for one month to provide guidance through the transition. Dr. Arpin was provided a detailed document outlined with the description of the role and responsibilities of the Division Director of Nursing and Allied Health in addition to relevant contact information. In addition, a document describing the specific monthly responsibilities was developed as a reference tool for Dr. Arpin.

During this transition time, Dr. Ouellet reviewed pertinent aspects of the director role. Dr. Arpin was mentored as she undertook administrative duties under the guidance of Dr. Ouellet during this time. This included conducting student exit interviews with students under the guidance of Dr. Ouellet. The

onboarding of students to a variety of clinical facilities was also completed to include administrative attestation reports. The process of faculty evaluations, various state meetings requiring attendance and input were also explained in detail. Dr. Arpin attended several meetings with Dr. Ouellet where she was introduced as the new Interim Director. Dr.'s Ouellet and Arpin share a professional relationship in which continued mentoring and correspondence is welcome.

Dr. Arpin has previously worked directly with the DON as both a course coordinator and faculty member during her time at TRCC. As course coordinator, she provided oversight of faculty and students beyond the regular teaching workload. This included the planning and scheduling of curriculum components. Dr. Arpin was actively involved the ACEN re-accreditation process that TRCC undertook in 2018.

Dr. Arpin has experience as a manager of programs and staff prior to coming to TRCC. As seen in her CV, she developed and managed multiple programs. These required strong organizational and communication skills. These programs were overseen by both CT DPH and national accrediting agencies. As a result, Dr. Arpin has a strong understanding of meeting regulatory requirements.

The workload for this position is entirely administrative.

Narrative: The Academic Division Director – Nursing and Allied Health Programs is accountable for assuring the successful conduct of the Division's programs and for the optimum learning outcomes of its students through effective performance in these essential functional areas:

- Faculty selection and professional development
- Instructional quality
- Budget and fiscal management
- Administration and resource management
- Program evaluation and assessment
- Community relations
- Student relations

In addition to the accountabilities listed above, the Academic Division Director - Nursing and Allied Health Programs is required to carry out the essential duties of:





The UConn School of Nursing is requesting a 12-month temporary teaching faculty education waiver for Carly Muller to teach the clinical portion of NURS 3334 Theory and Nursing Practice for Perinatal and Women's Health. Carly Muller is currently matriculated in an MSN program at Chamberlain University for an advanced degree in nursing education and she has her BSN from Quinnipiac University.

We have experienced significant difficulty in securing maternity clinical placements and finding MSN prepared faculty to teach the clinical portion of the course for the spring 2022 semester. The COVID-19 pandemic has heightened these challenges, with MSN prepared nurse educators leaving the bedside and clinical teaching for other opportunities. Additionally, with other regional nursing programs beginning their clinical rotations in this specialty area, we have also lost clinical placements and experienced faculty that have taught for our school for several years. Carly will be the only adjunct clinical faculty member teaching for our undergraduate nursing programs that will require a waiver from the Connecticut Board of Examiners for this semester. She will be teaching clinical on the maternity unit at Middlesex Hospital where she is employed. This rotation will be with 11 junior-level BSN students in their second clinical semester who will rotate in an A/B weekly pattern. There will be no more than 6 students on the unit each clinical day.

Carly Muller has continuously demonstrated her leadership skills on the maternity unit at Middlesex Hospital for the past several years. She is identified as one of the primary preceptors in her department, orienting and training both new nurses as well as experienced nurses who are new to this specialty area. She has created teaching tools and references to provide to her preceptees to ensure they feel well supported and organized as they acclimate to this unique population of patients. Carly is an EPIC "Super User" and has been instrumental in the electronic medical record transition in her department. She also works very closely with the nursing students and instructors when they are on her unit for a clinical rotation, but she has not yet had an opportunity to formally be the instructor as she works towards completing her MSN.

We have an experienced MSN adjunct faculty who will be paired in working directly with Carly. Melissa Revicki is a master's prepared nursing educator who has taught for UCONN for several years as an adjunct clinical faculty in the maternity course. Melissa is also the unit-based educator for Middlesex's maternity unit. Unfortunately, Melissa is only available to teach the clinical group up until spring break in March 2022. Melissa will teach the clinical group for the first half of the semester (1/18/22-3/12/22) while mentoring and orienting Carly to the clinical instructor position. This will allow Carly to have a smooth transition to be the lead instructor after spring break through the end of the semester (3/21/22-4/29/22). We will ensure that Carly has a formal orientation to the instructor position and follows Middlesex policy with badging and EPIC sign-on to delineate her as the clinical instructor for the group.

There is ample mentoring set in place for her, and her experience as a nurse in the department where she will be teaching makes her a strong candidate for the teaching waiver.

Currently UConn School of Nursing has an acceptable level of graduates' performance as defined by a NCLEX first-time pass rate of 96%. Only one other temporary waiver has been approved for adjunct faculty member, Kara Parker, BS, RN, [Kara Parker graduated with her MSN in 2021] and two permanent waivers for Drs. Thomas Van Hoof and Thomas Long. With our current number of 190 full- and part-time faculty members who are in compliance with section 20-90-51 subsection (b) and have earned advanced degrees in nursing and appropriate nursing education or experience in their teaching areas, fulfillment of this waiver request would still put us far below the total number of waivers allowed at the 90% threshold.



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
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

SUMMARY SUSPENSION ORDER

WHEREAS, the Department of Public Health having moved for an order of summary suspension in this matter and having submitted duly verified affidavits in support of its motion; and,

WHEREAS, said affidavits allege facts which show violations of §20-99(b) of the Connecticut General Statutes, and which imperatively require emergency action in that the public health, safety or welfare of the citizens of the State of Connecticut is in clear and immediate danger.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to §4-182(c) and §19a-17(c) of the Connecticut General Statutes, it is hereby **ORDERED**, by vote of the Board of Examiners for Nursing:

- 1. That license number 040682 of Ashley Lambert to practice as a licensed practical nurse in the State of Connecticut is hereby summarily suspended pending a final determination by the Board of Examiners for Nursing regarding the allegations contained in the Statement of Charges, and
- 2. That a hearing in this matter is scheduled for the 15th day of December 2021, at 9:00 a.m. The hearing will be held remotely via Microsoft TEAMS.

MEMORANDUM OF DECISION

I

Procedural Background

On March 12, 2013, the Department of Public Health ("Department") filed a Statement of Charges ("Charges") with the Board of Examiners for Nursing ("Board"). Board ("Bd.") Exhibit ("Ex.") 1. The Charges allege violations of Chapter 378 of the Connecticut General Statutes ("Conn. Gen. Stat.") by Natalie Primini ("Petitioner"), which would subject Petitioner's licensed practical nurse ("L.P.N.") license to disciplinary action pursuant to Conn. Gen. Stat. §§ 19a-17 and 20-99(b). Bd. Ex. 1.

On April 3, 2013, the Department filed a Motion for Summary Suspension ("Motion") with the Board, which was granted. Bd. Ex. 2.

Based on the allegations in the Charges, the Board found that Petitioner's continued nursing practice presented a clear and immediate danger to public health and safety. Accordingly, on April 3, 2013, pursuant to Conn. Gen. Stat. §§ 4-182(c) and 19a-17(c), the Board ordered that Petitioner's L.P.N. license be summarily suspended pending a final determination by the Board of the allegations contained in the Charges ("Summary Suspension Order"). Bd. Ex. 2.

On April 17, 2013, Petitioner appeared at the hearing. She was not represented by an attorney. Attorney Diane Wilan represented the Department. Transcript ("Tr.") 4/17/13, p. 4. The Board granted Petitioner's request for a continuance. Tr. 4/17/13, pp. 5-6.

On April 19, 2013, the hearing was rescheduled to convene on June 5, 2013. Bd. Ex. 4.

On June 5, 2013, the Board granted Petitioner's request for a second continuance. The hearing was rescheduled to convene on September 18, 2013. Bd. Ex. 6.

On September 17, 2013, Attorney Joseph Summa filed an appearance on Petitioner's behalf and requested a six-month continuance to permit Petitioner to seek medical treatment. Bd. Ex. 8. The Board granted the request, and the hearing was continued until March 19, 2014. Bd. Ex. 7.

On May 7, 2014, following a number of additional continuance requests, all of which were granted by the Board, the Board held the hearing. Neither Petitioner nor her attorney was present. Attorney Diane Wilan represented the Department. Tr. 5/7/14, p. 2.

Given that Petitioner did not file an Answer to the Charges (Tr. 5/7/14, pp. 5-6), Attorney Wilan orally moved to deem the allegations admitted. Tr. 5/7/14, pp. 6-7. The Board granted the motion. Tr. 5/7/14, p. 7.

Following the close of the record, the Board conducted fact finding.

Based on the record in the case filed in Petition No. 2013-69, the Board ordered the revocation of Petitioner's license number 034112 to practice as a L.P.N. in the State of Connecticut. Revocation of the license was effective on August 20, 2014.

On June 29, 2019, Petitioner requested a hearing before the Board, seeking reinstatement of her L.P.N. license. Petitioner ("Pet.") Ex. 1. The Department did not file an objection to Petitioner's request for a hearing.

Pursuant to Petitioner's request for a reinstatement hearing, the Board mailed Petitioner, via her email address of record with the Department (natprimini@comcast.net) a Notice of Hearing ("Notice") dated September 15, 2020. Bd. Ex. 1. The Notice informed Petitioner that the hearing was scheduled for November 18, 2020. *Id*.

On November 10, 2020, the Department notified Petitioner by email that the hearing was rescheduled to January 20, 2021. *Id*.

On January 20, 2021, the Board held a hearing on Petitioner's request for reinstatement of her L.P.N. license. Petitioner was present via video/teleconference and was self-represented. Attorney Diane Wilan represented the Department.

On January 20, 2021, Petitioner requested a continuance in order to provide the Department with records that were not filed in time for the January 20, 2021 hearing. Tr. 1/20/2021, pp. 11-21. The continuance was granted to March 17, 2021. Tr. 1/20/2021, pp. 22-24, 30.

On March 17, 2021, the hearing reconvened. Petitioner was present via video/teleconference. Attorney Diane Wilan represented the Department. Tr. 3/17/2021, p. 3. Following the close of the record, the Board conducted fact finding.

Each member of the Board attests that he or she was present at the hearing or has reviewed the record, and that this decision is based entirely on the record, the law, and the

Board's specialized professional knowledge in evaluating the evidence. *Pet v. Department of Health Services*, 228 Conn. 651 (1994).

II

Findings of Fact

Based on the testimony given and the exhibits offered into evidence, the Board makes the following findings of fact:

- 1. Petitioner previously held Connecticut L.P.N. license number 034112. Dept. Ex. 1.
- 2. During December 8 through December 10, 2012, Petitioner, while working as a L.P.N. at Masonic Healthcare administered acetaminophen to a patient instead of Percocet, as prescribed; failed to follow proper medication administration procedures; and/or failed to completely, properly and/or accurately document medical or hospital records. Dept, Ex. 1, p. 4; Tr. 1/20/2021, p. 6.
- 3. On August 20, 2014, the Board issued an Order revoking Petitioner's L.P.N. license based on Petitioner's failure to conform to the accepted standards of the nursing profession when she engaged in illegal conduct, incompetence, or negligence in carrying out her usual nursing functions. *Id*.
- 4. On June 29, 2019, Petitioner requested a hearing before the Board, seeking reinstatement of her L.P.N. license. Pet. Ex. 1.
- 5. Petitioner submitted documentation in support of her request for the reinstatement of her L.P.N. license. The documents included Petitioner's self-assessment essays (Pet. Ex. 1, 3), a reference letter from her employer, for the seventh month period from December 2018 to May 3, 2019, recommending reinstatement of Petitioner's license (Pet. Ex. 2), a prescription drug taper plan (Pet. Ex. 4, under seal), treatment records and drug test results from 11/1/13 through 6/25/2021 Pet. Ex. 5-12 (under seal). Tr. 1/20/2021, pp. 4-5; Tr. 3/17/2021, pp. 6-11.
- 6. Petitioner was a credible witness. Tr. 3/17/2021, pp. 14-16.
- 7. The Board finds that Petitioner presented sufficient and credible evidence to satisfy her burden of proof that she is able to resume nursing and practice with reasonable skill and safety.

III

Discussion and Conclusions of Law

Conn. Gen. Stat. § 19a-17(e) provides, in pertinent part, that the Board "may reinstate a license that has been suspended or revoked if after a hearing, such board is satisfied that the practitioner . . . is able to practice with reasonable skill and safety to patients, customers, or the

public in general. As a condition of reinstatement, the board or commission or the department may impose disciplinary or corrective measures authorized under this section."

The Petitioner has the burden of satisfying the Board that she is able to practice nursing with reasonable skill and safety. At the hearing, the Department had no objections to Petitioner's request for reinstatement of her license. The Board finds that Petitioner presented sufficient and credible evidence to satisfy her burden of proof that she is able to resume nursing and practice with reasonable skill and safety. Findings of Fact ("FF") 2-7.

Prior to the hearing, Petitioner was informed that she would be required to provide evidence at the reinstatement hearing that documented the "outcomes of [her] efforts toward recovery" over an extended period of time. Bd. Ex. 1. The Petitioner was also advised that such evidence should include all of the following:

- Documentary or testimonial evidence from her therapist documenting a lengthy
 period of drug/alcohol free status documented by therapy reports, evidencing her
 ability to administer safe nursing care, including the administration of controlled
 substances;
- 2) personal references documenting her emotional health and work habits;
- 3) documentary or testimonial evidence from current and past employers documenting her ability to carry out assigned duties responsibly and accurately and her potential for functioning safely and effectively as a nurse; and
- 4) documentation of Petitioner's participation in support groups and support of a sponsor, as well as the outcome of her participation in such support groups, if applicable.

Id.

At the hearing, Petitioner submitted documentation in support of her request for the reinstatement of her license. The documents included Petitioner's self-assessment essays (Pet. Ex. 1, 3), a reference letter from her employer, for the seven-month period from December 2018 to May 3, 2019, recommending reinstatement of Petitioner's license (Pet. Ex. 2), a prescription drug taper plan (Pet. Ex. 4, under seal), treatment records and drug test results from 11/1/13 through 6/25/2021. Pet. Ex. 5-12 (under seal). Tr. 1/20/2021, pp. 4-5; Tr. 3/17/2021, pp. 6-11. FF 5.

In her December 14, 2019 personal assessment essay, Petitioner wrote that in 2011 she began to self-medicate with pain medication for depression and anxiety, for which she sought

treatment in 2013. Pet. Ex. 3, p. 1 (under seal). She also stated that she accepts full responsibility for her actions which lead to the revocation of her L.P.N. license. Pet. Ex. 3, pp. 2-3 (under seal).

At the hearing, Petitioner credibly testified that she has been clean and sober for the past seven years and all of her drug screens have been negative. Tr. 1/20/2021 pp. 7-8. Petitioner also testified that she takes her sobriety seriously and has grown a lot since 2012. She testified that she "knows that it [her sobriety] is not something that you can just stop doing." Tr. 3/1/2021, p. 16. Currently, Petitioner has two jobs, one working as a tech or scribe in an ophthalmology practice (Tr. p. 1/20/2021, p. 9), and the other as a part time position as a direct support professional, working with patients with intellectual disabilities, mental challenges, and autism. Pet. Ex. 1, p. 3. She attends a monthly women's support group, and regularly participates in individual and group therapy and counseling. Tr. 3/17/2021, p. 15.

Petitioner has assured the Board that she is prepared to take any required retraining or L.P.N. refresher courses and to sit for the NCLEX exam. She plans to continue her formal education and obtain a R. N. license in the future. Pet. Ex. 1, p. 4; Pet. Ex. 3, p. 2 (under seal).

As noted in the Findings of Fact and the foregoing discussion, the Board finds that Petitioner has presented relevant and credible evidence to sustain her burden of proof that she is able to resume the practice of nursing with reasonable skill and safety, pursuant to the Order below.

IV

Order

Pursuant to Conn. Gen. Stat. §§ 19a-17 and 20-99, the Board hereby orders that Petitioner's, Natalie Primini's, L.P.N. license number 034112 is hereby reinstated under the following terms and conditions:

- Petitioner's L.P.N. license shall be placed on probation for a period of two years under the terms and conditions listed below. If any of the conditions of probation are not met, Petitioner's L.P.N. license may be subject to disciplinary action pursuant to Conn. Gen. Stat. § 19a-17.
 - A. During the period of probation, the Department shall pre-approve Petitioner's employment and/or change of employment within the nursing profession.

- B. Respondent shall not be employed as a nurse for a personnel provider service, assisted living services agency, homemaker-home health aide agency, or home health care agency, and shall not be self-employed as a nurse for the period of probation.
- C. Petitioner shall provide a copy of this Decision to any and all employers if employed as a nurse during the probationary period. The Department shall be notified in writing by any employer(s), within 30 days of the commencement of employment, as to receipt of a copy of this Decision.
- D. If employed as a nurse, Petitioner shall cause employer reports to be submitted to the Department by her immediate supervisor during the entire probationary period. Employer reports shall be submitted commencing with the report due on the first business day of the month following employment as a nurse. Employer reports shall be submitted at least monthly during the entire probationary period.
- E. The employer reports cited in Paragraph D above shall include documentation of Petitioner's ability to practice nursing safely and competently. Employer reports shall be submitted directly to the Department at the address cited in Paragraph Q below.
- F. Should Petitioner's employment as a nurse be involuntarily terminated or suspended, Petitioner and her employer shall notify the Department within 72 hours of such termination or suspension.
- G. Petitioner shall successfully complete course work in a licensed practical nurse refresher program, and successfully passing of the NCLEX-LPN examination. Within 30 days of successful completion of the course work and NCLEX-LPN examination, Petitioner shall provide proof to the satisfaction of the Department of such completion.
- H. If Petitioner pursues further training in any subject area that is regulated by the Department, Petitioner shall provide a copy of this Decision to the educational institution or, if not an institution, to Petitioner's instructor. Such institution or instructor shall notify the Department in writing as to receipt of a copy of this Decision within 15 days of receipt. Said notification shall be submitted directly to the Department at the address cited in Paragraph Q below.

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- I. At her expense, Petitioner shall engage in therapy and counseling for chemical dependency with a licensed or certified therapist, approved by the Department, during the entire period of probation.
- J. Petitioner shall provide a copy of this Decision to her therapist. The Department shall be notified in writing by her therapist, within 30 days of the effective date of this Decision, as to receipt of a copy of this Decision.
- K. Petitioner shall cause evaluation reports to be submitted to the Department by her therapist during the entire probationary period. Therapist reports shall be submitted monthly for the entire probationary period.
- L. The therapist reports cited in Paragraph K above shall include documentation of dates of treatment, and an evaluation of Petitioner's progress, including alcohol and drug free status, and ability to practice nursing safely and competently.

 Therapist reports shall be submitted directly to the Department at the address cited in Paragraph Q below.
- M. Submit to observed random urine screens as follows:
 - (1) At her expense, Petitioner shall be responsible for submitting to observed random chain of custody urine screens for alcohol and drugs for the entire probationary period, at a testing facility approved by the Department. Random alcohol/drug screens shall be legally defensible in that specimen donor and chain of custody can be identified throughout the screening process.
 - (2) Petitioner shall be responsible for notifying the laboratory, her therapist, the Department, and her prescribing practitioner of any drug(s) she is taking. For any prescription of a controlled substance(s) for more than two consecutive weeks, Petitioner shall cause the provider prescribing the controlled substance(s) to submit monthly reports to the Department until such time as the controlled substance(s) are no longer prescribed. The reports shall include the following:
 - a. A list of controlled substances prescribed by the provider for Petitioner;
 - b. A list of controlled substance(s) prescribed by other providers;
 - c. An evaluation of Petitioner's need for the controlled substances;
 - d. An assessment of Petitioner's continued need for the controlled substance(s).

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- (3) There must be at least one weekly random alcohol/drug screen during the entire probationary period.
- (4) Random alcohol/drug screens shall be negative for the presence of alcohol and drugs. All urine screens for alcohol will be tested for Ethyl Glucuronide (EtG) and Ethyl Sulfate (EtS) metabolites. All positive screen results shall be confirmed by the Gas Chromatograph Mass Spectrometer (GC/MS) testing method. Chain of custody documentation must accompany all laboratory reports and/or the laboratory reports must indicate that chain of custody procedures have been followed.
- (5) Random alcohol/drug screens must include testing for the following substances:

Amphetamines
Barbiturates
Benzodiazepines
Cannabinoids (THC Metabolites)
Cocaine
Meperidine (Demerol)
Fentanyl
Tramadol

Methadone Methaqualone Opiates (Metabolites) Phencyclidine (PCP) Propoxyphene Ethanol (alcohol) Stadol

- (6) Laboratory reports of random alcohol and drug screens shall be submitted directly to the Department, at the address cited in Paragraph Q below, by Petitioner's therapist, personal physician, or the testing laboratory.
- N. Petitioner shall not obtain for personal use and/or use alcohol or any drug that has not been prescribed for her for a legitimate purpose, by a licensed health care practitioner authorized to prescribe medications. Petitioner shall not abuse and/or excessively use any drugs that are prescribed for a legitimate medical purpose.
- O. Petitioner is hereby advised that the ingestion of poppy seeds may produce a positive drug screen result indicating the presence of opiates/morphine. The ingestion of mouthwash, over the counter cough suppressants and/or cold/flu remedies may produce a positive result indicating the presence of alcohol. For that reason, any food substance containing poppy seeds, mouthwash and over the counter cough suppressants and/or cold/flu remedies should be avoided

during the probationary period. In the event that a drug/alcohol screen is positive for opiates/morphine and/or alcohol, the ingestion of poppy seeds, mouthwash over the counter cough suppressants and/or cold/flu remedies shall not constitute a defense to such positive screen.

- P. The Department must be informed in writing prior to any change of address.

- 2. Any deviation from the terms of probation, without prior written approval by the Board, shall constitute a violation of probation, which will be cause for an immediate hearing on charges of violating this Order. Any finding that Petitioner has violated this Order will subject Petitioner to sanctions under Conn. Gen. Stat. §§ 19a-17(a) and (c), including but not limited to, the revocation of her license. Any extension of time or grace period for reporting granted by the Board shall not be a waiver or preclude the Board's right to take subsequent action. The Board shall not be required to grant future extensions of time or grace periods. Notice of revocation or other disciplinary action shall be sent to Petitioner's address of record which is deemed to be the most current address reported to the Practitioner Licensing and Investigations Section of the Healthcare Quality and Safety Branch of the Department).
- 3. This document has no bearing on any criminal liability without the written consent of the Director of Medicaid Fraud Control Unit or the Bureau Chief of the Division of Criminal Justice's Statewide Prosecution Bureau.
