Autism Waiver Update by Amy Dumont:

- Waiting list of 2005 individuals: 2 over the age of 65, 12 between ages 18 and 65, 18 and under. 172 individuals currently being served on the waiver
- Average caseload per Case Manager is 37
- HR recently approved 1 more Case Manager
- 15 individuals declined slots, 4 refused, 2 moved out of state, 4 chose other waivered programs and 5 were unable to locate
- 4 new Providers were approved and currently within enrollment process with Gainwell
- Plan to move 200 from the waitlist. Difficult to specify the timeframe as the process takes time due to financial eligibility
- Individuals must utilize at least 1 waivered service to stay active on the waiver
- Amy suggested inviting Paul Chase to an ASDAC meeting to explain the financial eligibility process
- Ideal Case Manager numbers are cap of 40 individuals at
- Lynn Ricci suggested tracking metrics such as: prior spots, new spots, total, assigned, assigned no provider available, receiving services, offered declined, assigned but choosing not to engage at this time
- Yana Razumnaya suggested an emergency plan for individuals on the waiver. Unfortunately, this is not a waivered service

Governor's Autism Proposal Presentation by Judy Dowd and Claudio Gualteri (See attached)

Lead agency responsibility transfers from Department of Social Services (DSS) to Office of Policy and Management's (OPM) Health and Human Services Policy and Planning Division in order to:

 Better coordinate autism services across a fragmented system where several state agencies and school districts either directly provide or oversee services for individuals on the autism spectrum

- Allow a more holistic review of autism services to identify gaps in the service continuum and work to improve cross-agency coordination going forward
- HB 6665 An Act Concerning Recommendations for Health and Human Services implements the changes
- Section 1(a) designates OPM as the lead agency to coordinate with state agencies that have responsibility for providing services to persons diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder
- Section 1(b) outlines areas of focus for OPM including:
 - o Early intervention services for any child under the age of three
 - Education, recreation, habilitation, vocational, transition services for individuals aged three to twenty-one
 - Services for adults over the age of twenty-one
 - Housing assistance
 - Services that address the intersection of autism services and the criminal justice system
 - Coverage of autism services under commercial insurance and by other payors
 - o Workforce training specific to autism spectrum disorder; and
 - Other services deemed necessary by the Secretary of OPM
- Section 1(d) requires OPM to make recommendations to the Governor and committees of cognizance concerning legislation and funding required to provide necessary services to persons diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder
- Section 1 (e) requires OPM to research and locate possible funding streams for the continued development and implementation of services for persons diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder
- Section 2 Autism Council Membership and responsibilities remain unchanged. Changes include:
- Section 2(c) which moves the council under OPM for administrative purposes
 - Funding provided in the Governor's budget for dedicate FTE to organize the council and ensure there is meaningful engagement into policy development across the spectrum of service needs
- Section 2(e) which moves the entity the council advises from the Commissioner of Social Services to the Secretary of the Office of Policy and Management consistent with the proposed change in lead agency status
- Section 3 confirms that the Division of Autism Spectrum Disorder Services in the Department of Social Services will continue to oversee the operation of Medicaid state plan services and the autism waiver
- Sections 13 -17 are technical fixes
