## History

The Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame was established to increase the awareness of the lifetime contributions of Veterans after completion of honorable military service. The Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame is not a military hall of fame. Those selected for the honor of induction are Veterans who honorably served their country through military service and who continue to serve and inspire their fellow man with their deeds and accomplishments throughout their lifetime.

Each year the committee selects inductees from applications received from across the state and nation. These Veterans will be leaders in a variety of areas, such as arts, education, public service, volunteer activities, and community and business leadership to name a few. Most importantly, they will have made significant impacts on the lives of others and their communities.

To be eligible for the Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame, the nominee must have served their country honorably in a branch of military service and continued to serve their communities, state and nation after discharge. Because so many of America's Veterans continue to give to their communities, state and nation after honorable military service, the Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame seeks to recognize them for their countless contributions to society.

The Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame is administered by the Connecticut Department of Veterans Affairs and the Connecticut Military Department on behalf of the Office of the Governor.

The first class of the Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame was inducted in November 2005 and includes the 41st President of the United States, George Herbert Walker Bush.

In 2015, a plaque was unveiled and placed in the Legislative Office Building with the names of all Inductees of the Connecticut Veterans Hall of Fame since 2005. Each future class of Inductees will be named on this plaque.




KEVIN BROWN "RED EAGLE" Guilford

Since his return to Connecticut in 2013, Kevin Brown has walked, run, marched, hiked, rucked, driven his motorcycle, parachuted, and of course, given words of inspiration at the microphone for a variety of awareness and fundraising events each year on behalf of Veterans. He has lived a life of public service, as he states "it's in my DNA". Kevin's desire and ability to leverage the great visibility that comes with his role as chairman of the Mohegan Tribe to highlight the needs of Veterans and showcase their accomplishments, especially those of Native Americans, is remarkable. His voice helps to amplify those of the many unsung heroes who go about their daily lives of service without having access to his very public platform. Under his leadership, in 2015, the Mohegan Tribe hosted the first Vets Rock, a career fair and concert at Mohegan Sun which is now held annually around Veterans Day. Vets Rock provides a multitude of services for former military personnel, including job training, free healthcare, and job matching, all at no cost to Veterans. In 2016, the event also included the Wall That Heals which is a ½ scale replica of the Vietnam Veterans Memorial in DC. Each year the costs for the event, which are valued in the thousands, are donated by the Mohegan Tribe. It is estimated that within the next few years, more than 10,000 Veterans will have benefitted from the Vets Rock effort. Kevin serves on Boards for the Chamber of Commerce of Eastern Connecticut, Channel 3 Kids Camp, American Heart Assoc. Southeastern CT Heart Walk, National Native American Veterans Memorial at the Smithsonian's National Museum of the American Indian, National Coast Guard Museum and Mystic Center for Hospice Care and Walk 2018 to name a few.

Dan Camilliere's desire is to care for the needs of others. After serving in the US Army, Dan and his brother-in-law opened a Drug Store in the South End of Hartford. Back then, customers paid cash for their purchases, there were no credit cards. When people came into the store with a prescription to fill and didn't have the cash to pay for it, Dan would give them "credit" and let them pay it back over time. He felt that the most important thing was to get the medication to the individual so they could get better. Dan wanted to do more for people and decided he would run for the Hartford Council to help the people of Hartford. He later became a State Senator representing Hartford to even further his efforts on the concerns and issues of the people he represented. His concern for the youth of the communities he served got him involved with the local school PTO. Moving to Wethersfield, he became Mayor and again, focused on the youth in the community. Dan served on many Boards and Commissions and continues to serve on the Memorial Day Parade Committee and the Veterans Day Committee. His concern for the children of Wethersfield got him on the High School Renovation Committee and to assure the town moved forward economically, Dan still sits on the Redevelopment Commission. Within his community, Dan is a member of UNICO, an Italian Fraternal Organization, which motto is "Service above Self". Thirty-nine years ago, Dan organized the first annual Pasta Dinner which helped to raise funds for the victims of an earthquake in Italy. Future dinners have raised funds to give local high school graduates scholarships to attend college. Dan received UNICO's "Medal of Service" two years ago for his service to his community.



William Mason has been involved in several Veteran advocacy initiatives over the years. Having been severely wounded in Vietnam, he has never let his handicap affect his ability to accomplish anything he sets out to do. He served on the Veterans Hospital Committee at West Haven VA as a Veteran's advisor. He has assisted in drafting grants to enhance the Veteran Homeless, Suicide and Addition Assistance Programs such as the Errera Center in West Haven. He wrote a draft on the development of an outreach program for unemployed disabled Veterans which became the Disabled Veterans Outreach Program (DVOP). William set up the Operation of Transitional Assistance Training at the Naval Base in Groton for separating service members which was credited as the best Nationally in 1994. He assisted in achieving an Attorney General ruling and state statute change in favor of Reservist and Guard Obligations effecting CT Correction Officers, CT State Police and all other state agency employed Veterans and military reservists regarding military credit and reserve/guard obligation duties for credit towards retirement benefits. As an active parishioner of St. Anthony's Church in Prospect, he wrote a program called "Helping Hands" which was designed to provide assistance to disabled and elderly parishioners with simple home repairs through volunteers from the parish. The program still exists today.

After serving his country in Vietnam, Larry Riley returned to Middletown working security for the State of Connecticut and then over to Washington DC working with the United States Secret Service as part of the Explosive Detector Team, Larry again returned Middletown. He has been Commander of the VFW for five years. He served two – one year terms as Commander of the Middletown Council of Veterans Organization and is currently the Commander of the American Legion Post 75. Through the Veterans Administration, Larry is training pound and shelter dogs to be companion dogs for Veterans suffering from PTSD, TBI and other ailments that tend to make a Veteran become isolated. Larry has been honored by the Hartford Courant for his work connecting school children with Veterans. Larry and his fellow Middletown Veterans visit schools and help students learn about what it means to be a Veteran, the importance of the US Flag and serving your communities. In 2016, Larry was awarded the annual Middlesex Chamber of Commerce William J. Pomfret Service Award which is given to a Veteran in recognition of his/her distinguished service to the citizens of Connecticut and selfless commitment to public service. In 2017 Larry was honored by the City of Middletown by having a tree planted in his name for exceptional service as a Veteran to the city and its residents. The trees were planted in the Veterans Memorial Park near Wesleyan University. In June of 2018, Larry was honored by the Middletown Mayor with the annual City of Middletown Humanitarian Award for service as a Veteran and his community work. Larry serves on the Board of Trustees for the Greater Middletown Military Museum and is also a member of the Chamber of Commerce Support the Troops Breakfast & Award Committee.
