


## Transportation Documents – How They Fit Together

The Long-Range Transportation Plan is a federally mandated policy document that serve as a framework for preparing future, project-specific transportation plans. The Plan is generally updated every three to five years.



Describes the Department's plan to address critical transportation needs and current challenges.




Details a comprehensive financial summary of Capital Program expenditures.








Connecticut River Bridge Old Saybrook and Old Lyme, CT






## **CTDOT Capital Expenditures SFY2019 - SFY2023**





## CTDOT Committed Construction Dollars FFY2022 - FFY2024




#### **Project Category Definitions:**

- **Emergency Declarations:** Contracts issued to respond to unforeseen disasters
- Municipal (Local) Projects and Grants: Projects
   advertised by municipalities such as State Local
   Bridges, Off-system Bridges, Surface Transportation
   Program Urban (STP-U), Congestion Mitigation and
   Air Quality (CMAQ), Transportation Alternatives
   Program (TAP), Earmarks, etc. Grants to
   municipalities include Local Transportation Capital
   Improvement Program (LOTCIP), Transportation
   Rural Improvement Program (TRIP), Community
   Connectivity Grant Program (CCGP)
- Environmental Compliance: State pier remediation, Salt shed construction, and Contracts issued to address site remediation
- Public Transportation: Projects administered by CT Transit Districts
- Maintenance: Bridge Repair Unit (BRU) and Vendor-in-Place (VIP) Paving
- State Advertised Projects Design-Bid-Build: DOT advertised projects following the traditional Design-Bid-Build process

Complete Streets is a means to provide safe access for all users (pedestrians, persons using mobility aids, bicyclists, transit users and vehicle operators) by providing a comprehensive, integrated, and connected multi-modal network of transportation options.




