

How to Become Listed as a Nationally Certified Radon Measurement Professional in Connecticut

Step 1 - Attend a Radon Measurement Proficiency Course

Attend a two-day radon measurement proficiency course approved by one of the national radon certification agencies:

- The National Radon Proficiency Program (AARST-NRPP); or
- The National Radon Safety Board (NRSB)

The <u>Eastern Regional Radon Training Center (ERRTC)</u> at Rutgers University in New Brunswick, New Jersey offers a 5-day course that includes both radon measurement <u>and</u> mitigation.

Step 2 - Pass an examination

Complete and pass the national certification examination from NRPP or NRSB. This exam is offered at the end of day 2 of the measurement course. There is an additional fee required to take this exam.

Step 3 - Apply to NRPP or NRSB to become nationally certified

Submit a membership application to one of the two certifying agencies to become a nationally certified radon measurement service provider. Check their websites (see links above) for more information on their application process, continuing education requirements, and fees.

- Individuals will be issued an NRPP or NRSB card with a national radon certification number.
- Individuals will be listed on the NRPP or NRSB website under the *Radon Professional* search for the state of Connecticut.

The Connecticut Department of Public Health (CT DPH) will be downloading lists of Connecticut Radon Service Providers from the AARST-NRPP and NRSB websites. Those individuals who hold national radon measurement certifications under the Radon Professional search for Connecticut will be listed on the CT DPH Radon Program website.

How to Become Qualified to Conduct Radon Measurement Services in CT Public Schools

Completion of the ¹/₂ day CT DPH Course "Radon Measurement in CT Schools" is MANDATORY

The completion of Steps 1 through 3 is a prerequisite for attendance in this course.

• An individual must be nationally certified in Radon Measurement to enroll in the CT DPH "Radon Testing in CT Schools Course".

Enroll in the CT DPH "Radon Testing in CT Schools" course held annually by the CT DPH.
