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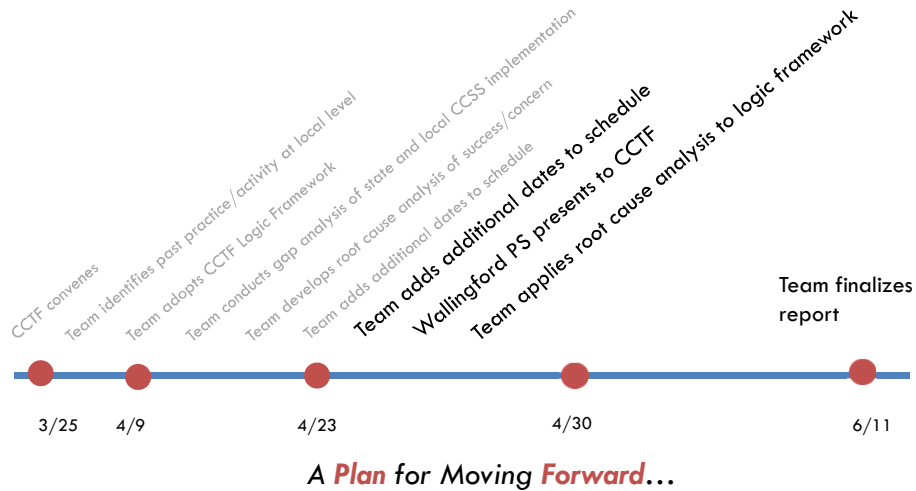

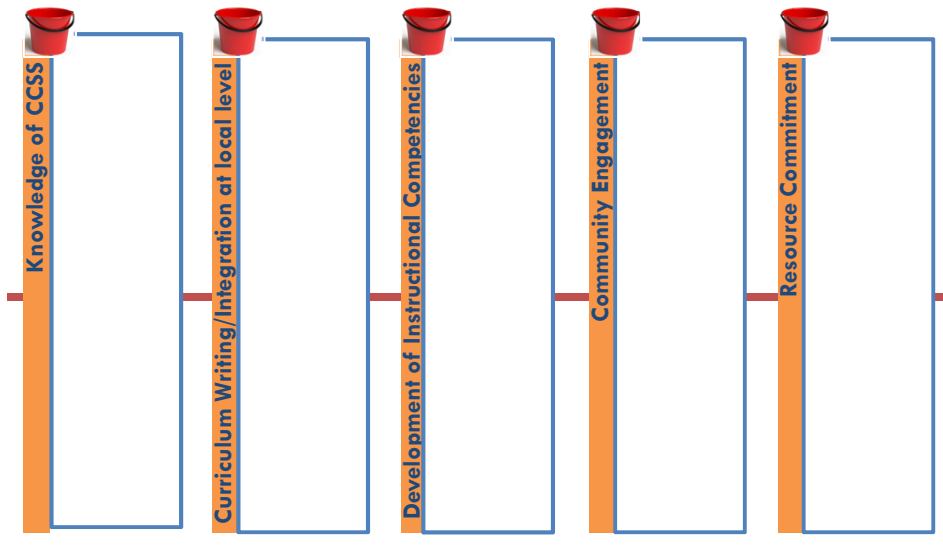

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Session IV Activity 1: A Presentation of Best Practice

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Norwich Public Schools:

- Enrollment-Pre-k to 8= 3,680
- School Structures:
 - ▣ 7 elem
 - ▣ 2 middle
 - ▣ 1 preschool
- District Demographics:
 - ▣ F/R lunch= 73.3%
 - ▣ Minority= 64.4%
 - ▣ ELL= 12.6% (464 students)
 - ▣ Languages Spoken= 33
 - ▣ SPED= 13.7%
- Budget:
 - ▣ \$14,551.77 per pupil
 - ▣ General Fund Budget= \$70,535,212.
 - ▣ Grants= \$9,897,313.
 - ▣ Staff= 33.5% grant funded

- To do this, we will engage in **targeted focus group studies** of individual buckets of the CCTF Logic Framework.



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Session IV Activity 3: Targeted Focus Group



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- **STEP 1:** Review the bucket that has been assigned to your group and develop a shared understanding of this element of the CCTF logic framework
- **STEP 2:** Repeat the Gallery Walk as a team and collect relevant samples (avoid duplication) that will accurately reflect implementation strength/concerns for the assigned element of the CCTF logic framework. *(Use sticky notes to record)*
- **STEP 3:** Review collected data and fill missing holes if applicable. *(Think comprehensive—state and local)*

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□ Recommendation/Recommend:

- verb (used with object) 1. to present as worthy of confidence, acceptance, use, etc.; commend; mention favorably: *to recommend an applicant for a job; to recommend a book.*
- 2. to represent or urge as advisable or expedient: *to recommend caution.*
- □ 3. to advise, as an alternative; suggest (a choice, course of action, etc.) as appropriate, beneficial, or the like: *He recommended the blue-plate special. The doctor recommended special exercises for her.*

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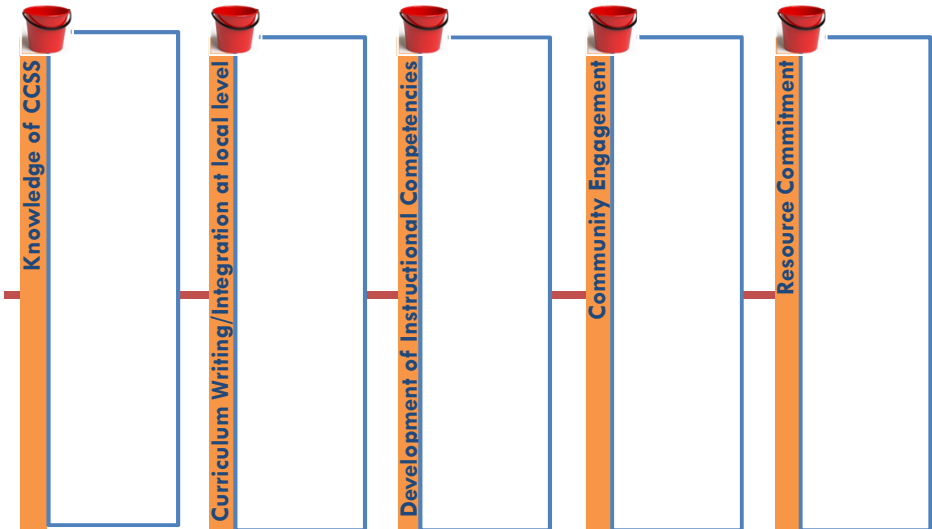
