COURSE ANNOUNCEMENT

The Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection, and the Police Officer Standards and Training Council's Field Services Training Division, in cooperation with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), is offering a five-day training seminar titled, "Fundamentals of Crisis Negotiation." The training session is designed as an introductory course. The course will be held Monday, October 21, 2024, through Friday, October 25, 2024, at the Connecticut Police Academy, 285 Preston Avenue, Meriden, 06450. Daily meeting times will be from 0830 to 1700. The lead instructor will be a Special Agent from the FBI's New Haven Field Office. Additional instructors for this course will include Special Agents from the FBI's New Haven Field Office, and negotiators from the Connecticut State Police and Trumbull Police Departments.

The presentation will focus on crisis negotiation concepts, a practical overview of negotiations, active listening techniques, role-play, abnormal psychology, mental health and crisis intervention considerations, legal aspects, and other specialty topics.

The seminar is specifically designed for an audience of patrol officers/first responders <u>without</u> previous crisis or hostage negotiation training who plan to become negotiators.

The class is limited to thirty (30) attendees.
