We need continually better systems that (1) align systemwide curriculum, instruction, staff development, assessment and data reporting; (2) provide more time for some students, more use of technology and more one-to-one interventions; and (3) expand preschool, early reading success and parent/family engagement in student learning.

We all agree we can do a lot better, but only if we have "the courage to acknowledge our poor performance and the will to seek solutions" (page 3). We cannot and will not do better without courage and leadership. Thank you for your efforts.
