**SUBJECT:** Updated College Career Pathway Guidelines

The College Career Pathways (CCP) program in Connecticut gives high school students the opportunity to experience Career and Technical Education (CTE) college-credit bearing courses taught by college-approved high school teachers. CCP is a concurrent enrollment program, which receives funding through the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Improvement Act of 2006.

The <u>College Career Pathways Guidelines</u> have been revised to reflect and highlight three (3) current Connecticut State Colleges and Universities College Career Pathways Administrative Procedures:

- **Service area partnerships**: Colleges may be granted permission to enter into partnership agreements regarding dual enrollment programming with secondary schools physically located outside of the college's service area.
- **Minimum qualifications**: High school teachers lacking the minimum qualification but having the desire to teach a Career and Technical Education course for college credit within a CCP Program may apply for approval through Alternative Minimum Qualifications. A high school teacher or principal may submit a resume, letter and approval to request exemption.
- **Multiple measures**: Each CCP should ascertain in collaboration with partnering high schools the most appropriate measures to determine student readiness for each course offered.
