SUBJECT:	McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Liaison

Educational stability resulting from the implementation of the McKinney-Vento Act currently provides rights and relief to thousands of homeless children and youth in Connecticut. This law provides the foundation to help students who are experiencing homelessness to continue receiving a quality and stable public school education.

With the beginning of a new school year, it is necessary to ensure that program records concerning local homeless education liaisons in Connecticut are kept up to date. Federal law requires that all local education agencies (LEAs) identify an appropriate staff person to serve in this capacity. The work of the liaisons includes building awareness of homelessness in their school systems, assisting in the identification of homeless children and youth, providing community outreach, and resolving issues that may arise while working with homeless students.

The Connecticut State Department of Education (CSDE) continues to maintain the Connecticut LEA Homeless Liaison Catalog, which lists all LEA liaisons, on the CSDE Web site <u>homeless liaison catalog</u>. All school districts are advised to review the contact information listed and notify the CSDE of any changes or corrections by September 10, 2014.
