Ordering the Brigance IED-II

Connecticut is currently utilizing the "Brigance Diagnostic Inventory of Early Development II" (also referred to as the Brigance IED-II or the Brigance). The Brigance IED-II Assessment Manual includes the required sub-tests and "alternate sub-tests" that have been identified as needing to be administered by school personnel in order to collect child specific information for reporting on the developmental and functional progress of children receiving special education and related services in the preschool grade. The administration and collection and reporting of child specific information at a child's entry to and exit from preschool is the state's system for meeting the federal early childhood outcome (ECO) requirement.

The **Brigance IED-II** must be administered as a criterion-referenced instrument to collect the early childhood outcome information on individual children with an IEP at two points in time, entry to and exit from the grade preschool. The assessment information and scoring must be completed for individual children in the **Brigance IED-II Developmental Record Book**. The State Department of Education will make sample data collection forms available to assist school districts in collecting and reporting child assessment information on the web-based early childhood outcome (ECO) data collection system.
