**Notice of Decision to Take Action  
On Proposed Regulation**

Re: Regulations Concerning Frozen Desserts

The Department of Consumer Protection held a public hearing on October 9, 2014 to solicit public input regarding proposed new administrative regulations concerning Frozen Desserts. Said public hearing had been properly noticed by the Secretary of the State on September 3, 2014.

The purpose of the proposed regulations is to create additional flexibility in the manufacturing processes used for frozen desserts in Connecticut. The Department of Consumer Protection's Division of Food and Standards will retain jurisdiction over the manufacturing of frozen desserts.

Written comments in support of the regulation update were received during the public comment period from Resolution Legal Group and the Director of the Department's Division of Food and Standards, Mr. Frank Greene. Oral comments in support of the regulation were also received. No comments were received in opposition to these proposed regulations, and no comments suggested changes to the proposed text. As such, no changes will be made to the proposed regulations.

The published version of the regulation, made available on the website of the Secretary of the State, will continue moving forward through the process leading to consideration by the Regulation Review Committee of the General Assembly. The Department will now continue the process by forwarding these Regulations to the Office of the Attorney General for review. Thank you for your interest in this proposed regulation and the work of the Department of Consumer Protection.
