



Connecticut Commission for Educational Technology December 2022 Executive Director's Report

Digital Equity

- Commission as State lead to address availability, affordability, adoption, and effective use, with funding from federal [Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act](#)
- Part of [inter-agency efforts](#) across DEEP ([BEAD](#) and ARPA programs), OPM ([mapping](#)), OCC ([policy](#)), and CEN (middle mile and [community wireless](#))
- Planning funds (\$736K) awarded December 1 to support development of state digital equity plan within the next year
- Capacity funds (~\$17M) to support implementation of digital equity plan, including efforts to expand and replicate successful digital navigation efforts
- Milestones include community outreach, establishment of Digital Equity Research Center (UConn Public Policy), state asset mapping, and report development
- October 26 Digital Equity Summit in Hartford drew more than 60 leaders of State agencies as well as service and advocacy groups to identify barriers and goals
- Reposting for Digital Equity Program Manager to lead day-to-day efforts
