002	4.3.1	Roof pitch statutory change – PA13-256

As discussed in the May 9, 2014 SBPAC Staff Activities Report, prior to 2013, General Statutes Sec. 10-291(b)(2) had required that new and renovated roofs on school building projects have a ½ inch per foot pitch. This was put into place under the assumption that ponding water on rooftops could create the possibility for leaks into the structure, causing mold and mildew from moisture entering the buildings. With evidence showing that other, more cost effective solutions accomplish the same goals, the SBPAC staff proposed and gained approval in the legislature for PA13-256, which changed roof pitch standards to roof designs that comply with the State Building Code. There is favorable evidence that this has led to significant reductions in roof replacement costs in school building projects.

In the first year that this change was made (2013), a number of school districts utilized and saw savings from it. The following school districts put out for bid both roof pitch requirements, in anticipation that the change might be coming. These districts saw real savings, as demonstrated, below.

This \$1,417,967 savings was 18% of roof replacement costs, with an average cost reduction of \$3.95 per sq. ft.

Analyzing 2014 projects for similar savings is more problematic. School districts have generally not submitted design documents at this stage of the school construction process, so there is not adequate information to determine the square footage of the roof replacements in these projects. However, for the roof replacement projects for which

districts have submitted this level of detail, a total savings of more than \$2 million can be estimated 1, as demonstrated below.

 $^{^1}$ This analysis estimated the savings from the new roof pitch standard for 2014 Priority List projects by multiplying the square footage of the roofs in the projects by \$3.95, which is the average savings achieved from the 2013 Priority List projects where the school districts received bid options for both the $\frac{1}{2}$ inch per foot and $\frac{1}{4}$ inch per foot standards.

Even though most of the costs of the projects listed as To-Be-Determined, above, are not for roofs alone, the fact that a small sample of the full list produced an estimate of more than \$2 million in savings shows a likelihood of additional savings for 2014's Priority List.

These cost savings demonstrate that the work of SBPAC and its staff, when acting on findings and recommendations of the formal report, have begun to accomplish both administrative and legislative initiatives in pursuit of improved processes for the management of School Building Projects.

A future staff activities report will discuss ongoing work to improve cost estimating for projects of less than \$2 million. This will allow for more accurate estimates of costs, such as the type of information this report analyzes, much earlier in the school construction process than is possible presently.
