Dear Madam Secretary:

I hereby return, without my signature, Senate Bill 989, *An Act Concerning Reemployment and the Municipal Employees' Retirement System*. This bill is identical to Senate Bill 704 of the 2013 Regular Session of the Connecticut General Assembly, which I also returned without my signature for the same reasons cited below.

Under current law, Municipal Employee Retirement System members who have retired cannot receive retirement benefits if they are reemployed by the municipality from which they retired or another participating municipality, unless they are working for less than twenty hours a week or less than ninety days a year.

Under this bill, retirees would be able to continue collecting full retirement benefits and receive compensation for full time employment. I believe this bill would impose an undue burden on municipalities and is inconsistent with the purpose of the municipal retirement system, which is intended to provide assistance to our retirees and not current employees.

For these reasons, I disapprove of Senate Bill 989, *An Act Concerning Reemployment and the Municipal Employees' Retirement System*. Pursuant to Section 15 of Article Fourth of the Constitution of the State of Connecticut, I am returning Senate Bill 989 without my signature.
