1938-- 12 FP616 C. mollisima

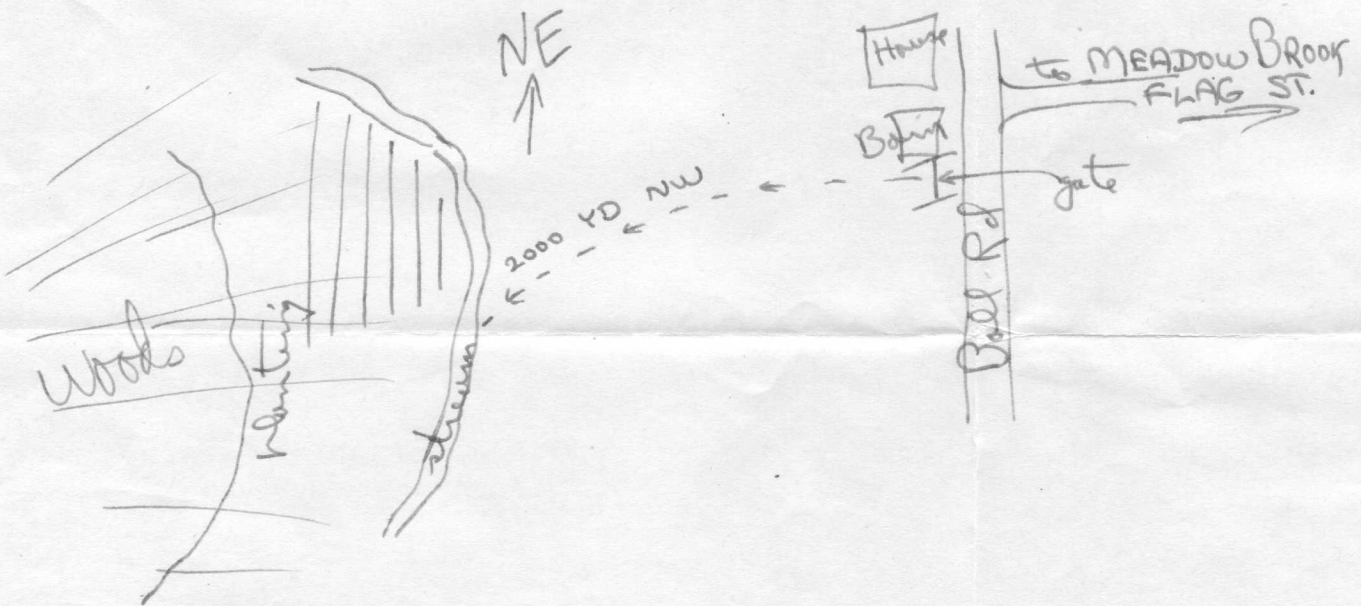

Mr. Hendrix is the county agent at Sevierville and lives there, trees are planted on his farm west of Knoxville, tenanted by J. C. Husky.

Directions to reach :

Leave Knoxville on the Western Ave. this eventually becomes the Ball-Camp Pike, follow this road for 5.3 miles from the Knox. city limit sign. At the Meadow Brook Flag station turn right onto a blue stone road. Follow this  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile to the Ball Road. Mr. Hendrix farm is on Ball Rd. at the point where the road from Meadow Brook Station joins it.

Trees are planted on a hillside about 2000 yd. NW of the barn on the South side of the hill. Soil is sandy loam and judging by size of corn quite rich. Trees make good growth each year, often three feet or so, but seem to die back every year. I think the trouble is the late spring freezes after the trees start to leaf out since there is little evidence of TB on most of the trees. Only one tree was found with bad CB. There is lots of old chestnut nearby.
