## **Department of Plant Pathology and Ecology**

The Department of Plant Pathology and Ecology anticipates a Seasonal Research Assistant position at the Plant Disease Information Office. This is a wonderful opportunity to obtain professional experience in support of plant pathology research and public services aimed at reducing the impact of plant diseases on crops, landscape plants, and ecosystems. We are looking for a motivated individual with a willingness to work and learn. Responsibilities of the position include receiving and documenting plant samples submitted for diagnosis, logging entries into a database, assisting with general laboratory tests and practices, and working in the seed testing program. Training is provided. Starting date is May 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024, and will run until October 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024, but have flexible start and end dates within this general timeframe.

The position is based at the Experiment Station's New Haven campus at 123 Huntington Street. The hours of work are 8:30 a.m.-4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday (35 hours/week), and the salary is \$16.00/hour (without benefits).
