03/03/21 Bridgeport, CT 850 Park Ave dwelling fire - the Bridgeport ECC received calls of a structure fire at the YMCA on Park Ave. This Charlie-5 assignment consisted of Engine 1, Engine 3, Engine 4, Engine 7 as RIT, Ladder 5, Ladder 11, Rescue 5, Safety 1 and both Battalions. Cars 1, 2, and 3 also responded with Admin-1, Training 2, Training 3 and Training 4. On arrival, companies reported smoke and fire showing from the 3rd floor on the D-side of the building. Companies stretched lines interior while Ladder 5 flew their bucket to the fire floor. Companies quickly knocked the bulk of the fire and worked on extensive overhaul of the fire room. There were no injuries and the Fire Marshal is investigating the cause of the fire.

Engine 11 quickly reported a column of smoke as they pulled out of quarters. On arrival, Engine 11 called a working fire on a 3 large story wood frame with fire on all floors. A 2nd Alarm was soon struck bringing additional resources in as the fire extended to the neighboring dwelling. Many special calls were made and many additional units responded to this fire. Companies engaged the fire in a defensive position soon after arriving with Chief John Alston taking command of the scene. There was minor extension to a building at 82 Lamberton St across the intersection. Companies were able to go interior once the buildings were deemed safe enough. Companies remained on scene well into the night mopping up. The NHFD Fire Investigation Unit is investigating the cause of the fire.

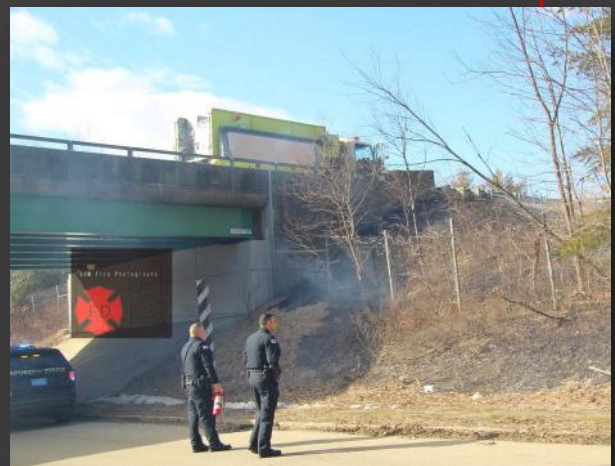

03/10/21 Fairfield, CT 1401 Kings Hwy. Roof top fire in an Avalon building - multiple calls, as well as a pull station alarm, were received by the Fairfield ECC reporting a structure fire at the new Alto Fairfield Metro apartment complex at 1401 Kings Highway. Company 2 arrived to find light smoke showing from the roof. Car 3 soon struck the all hands working fire with callbacks and chief office notification. 1 Engine was initially requested from Bridgeport as the working fire engine, this was soon upgraded to a request for a tower ladder as well. Fairfield companies combated fire in a gas fireplace on the roof of a 6-story apartment complex. The fire had escaped its housing and was active throughout the large decorative facade. Tower Ladder 2 was placed in service as a precaution as companies encountered initial problems accessing the interior of the facade. Bridgeport Engine 3 conducted primaries on the floors below the fire while Bridgeport Ladder 5 acted as RIT with Battalion 1 as an aide to the IC. Companies had the bulk of the fire knocked down about half an hour from the time of alarm. The fire was contained to the fireplace facade on the roof with no extension. 5 residents were displaced due to water damage to their apartments below the fire. The Fairfield Fire Marshal's office is investigating the cause of the fire. In total, Fairfield Engines 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5, Ladder 2, Rescue 1, Cars 1, 2, 3 and 5, Maintenance 1 and a fire marshal, along with Bridgeport Engine 3, Ladder 5 and Battalion 1 responded to this incident. There were no injuries.

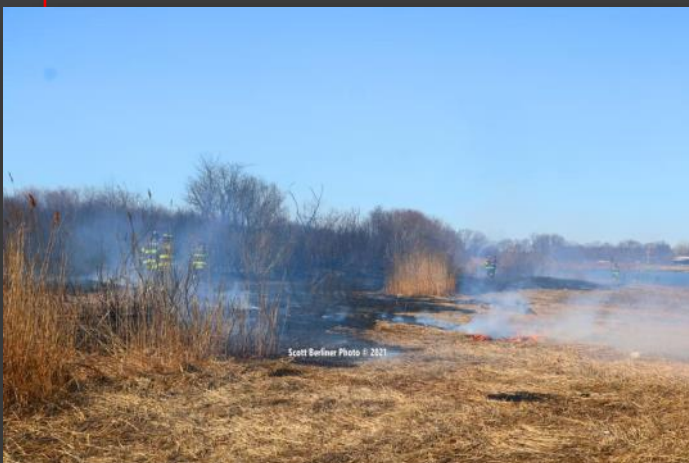

Engine 6, Engine 7, and Ladder 6 responded on the 2nd Alarm. Cars 1, 3 and FM-6 also responded. On arrival, Battalion 1 reported heavy fire showing from the A-side of a 2 1/2 story wood frame. Companies made an aggressive push interior battling heavy fire on floors 2 and 3 of the dwelling. As the fire was becoming knocked, smoke and fire started to show from the neighboring building at 306 Pequonnock St, a 2 story residential over commercial. Car 3 assumed command and struck a 2nd Alarm. Battalion 1 became Jones Ave Operations and Battalion 2 became Pequonnock St Operations. Companies made a push inside the 2nd floor apartments meeting heavy fire inside which soon dug itself into the cockloft. Companies then worked to open the roof and finally extinguish the fire. Companies had the fire under control in both buildings around 1:10pm. Companies remained on scene for over an hour in extensive overhaul. The Fire Marshal's office is investigating the cause of the fire.

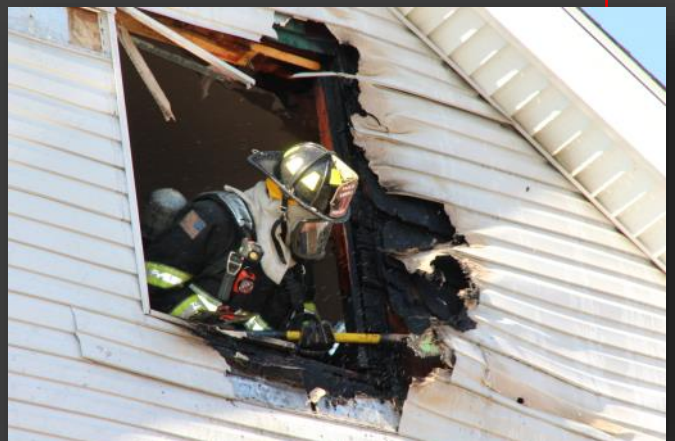
03/15/21 Mastic, NY 960 Montauk Hwy. exterior fire - On Monday March 15, 2021 at about 3:35 PM the Mastic Fire Department was activated for a report of a Commercial Structure Fire the T-Mobile Store 960 Montauk Highway. Chief Of Department Rudy Sunderman {5-12-30} & Assistant Chief Gene Martucci {5-12-31} responded to the scene first. On arrival Chief of Department Sunderman found smoke and flames visible exterior. The working fire was transmitted. The first due engines began stretching lines. Mutual aid was requested from Brookhaven FD was requested for RIT team, Mastic Beach Responded in to the scene for an Engine and Yaphank was original requested to stand by at Mastics HQ The fire was able to be quickly knocked down with the resources on scene however firefighters did have a decent amount of overhaul. The scene was placed under control around 4:30PM according to fire officials. Mastic Ambulance Company and Shirley ambulance were on scene for support and conducted rehab at the scene of firefighters. No civilians or firefighters were injured. During the course of operating at this fire Mutual aid companies from Yaphank and Mastic Beach responded to 2 additional calls for reported fires both quickly handled and all units were back in service around 5PM with the 1st scene being turned over to the Brookhaven Fire Marshal Office and SCPD Arson Squad.
