

Hazardous Materials Technician Certification Examination Application process for candidates participating in the Connecticut Fire Academy's 472 Pathways program.

Candidates for Hazardous Materials Technician Certification must be trained on all objectives of National Fire Protection Association Standard 472 at the Awareness, Operational, and Technician level to be eligible to make an application to participate in the certification examination process for the level of Hazardous Materials Technician.

Within the 472 Pathways Program, the required training is accomplished by attendance at a number of individual training modules delivered over an extended period of time or by a waiver of one or more modules as the result of a document review.

On the reverse side of this sheet is a listing of all required training modules. Next to each module is space to annotate when the module was completed, the initials of the instructor of the module, or whether the module was waived as the result of the document review process.

It is **your** responsibility as a potential candidate for Hazardous Materials Technician to ensure all modules are annotated as been completed by the initials of the instructor or whether they have been waived.

At the beginning of the Pathways Program the Connecticut Fire Academy staff member(s) who conducted the document review will have indicated on this sheet which module(s) have been waived. You must submit this form to the instructor at all of the remaining modules of instruction that you must take for annotation.

It is **your** responsibility to ensure that the reverse side of this form is completed before you apply to test. You **must** attach this **completed** form to the back of the Hazardous Materials Technician Certification Examination Application when you submit it to the Certification Division for testing. Applications that are submitted without this form completed properly will be returned and will delay your testing process.

It is an individual responsibility to submit your own completed application for testing at least 10 days prior to the practical skills test that you wish to participate in. It is not the responsibility of Commission on Fire Prevention and Control or Connecticut Fire Academy staff to submit an application on your behalf. Do not rely upon any other person to submit an application for you as any problems will be required to be rectified by you which will delay your testing process.
