11 VICE CHAIRMAN COLIN C. TAIT: This hearing  
12 will come to order. It's a continuation of the one that  
13 started this afternoon at 1:00 o'clock.

14 Is there anybody here from the public that  
15 would like to speak? This public session is here for the  
16 benefit of the public to make comments concerning our  
17 forecast reports for 2012 and 2013. Is there anybody  
18 here from the public? Is there anybody signed up on the  
19 sign-up sheet?

20 MR. BRIAN GOLEMBIEWSKI: There is no sign-  
21 ups.

22 MR. PHILIP T. ASHTON: Anybody? Raise  
23 your hand.

24 VICE CHAIRMAN TAIT: Is there a closing

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1 statement you want me to read?

2 A VOICE: Yes.

3 VICE CHAIRMAN TAIT: The Connecticut  
4 Siting Council has had the responsibility to review the  
5 forecasts of electric loads and resources of the State  
6 since 1972. Since that time, this Council has studied  
7 and reported on the utilities' plans to adequately  
8 forecast and meet the public's growing demand for  
9 electricity. The State of Connecticut and this agency  
10 understand that we must meet the challenges of a  
11 restructured electric industry to promote efficient and  
12 reliable electric generation and transmission, keep costs  
13 as low as reasonably possible, and protect our  
14 environment. On that basis, we ask for cooperation and  
15 innovation to identify changes and refinements that are  
16 necessary -- that will be necessary to make the siting  
17 process efficient, effective, and fair to protect the  
18 citizens of Connecticut.

19 Parties and intervenors may submit briefs  
20 and comments on the Council's draft report by July 12,  
21 2012.

22 Any person who has not become a party or  
23 intervenor, but desires to make his views known to the  
24 Council, may file a written statement with the Council

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1 by July 12, 2012.

2 I encourage all persons to identify any  
3 and all changes in the siting and forecast process you  
4 believe necessary.

5 Copies of the transcript of this hearing  
6 will be filed at the central office at 10 Franklin  
7 Square, New Britain, Connecticut.

8 I hereby declare this hearing adjourned.
