CL&P Pre-Hearing Interrogatories
Set One

1. Provide the actual and weather-normalized annual peak historical loads for The Connecticut Light and Power Company's (CL&P) service area for 2002 through 2011.
2. As a comparison, provide the predicted weather-normalized (i.e. 50/50) loads for 2002 through 2011 from the 2002 CL&P forecast report.
3. Explain the methodology of how historical actual peak load data is converted to weather-normalized historical peak load data.
4. On page 5 of the 2012 CL&P Forecast, CL&P notes that, "This forecast includes explicit additions to the electrical energy output requirements due to electric vehicles." Provide any assumptions made regarding electrical energy consumption by electric vehicles.
5. On page 8 of the 2012 CL&P Forecast, there are no gigawatt-hours (GWh) reported from ISO-NE's Load Response Program (ISOLRP). Is this because the limited number of hours that the ISOLRP is in use results in a negligible energy savings?
6. On page 8 of the CL&P Forecast, the Net Electrical Energy Output Requirements are listed. Are these based on the 50/50 forecast scenario? If yes, provide a similar table based on the Extreme Hot Weather Scenario.
7. Provide the basic underlying assumptions associated with the distributed generation (DG) included in Table 2-2 of the 2012 CL&P Forecast, including but not limited to the DG projects approved, number of megawatts of each DG project, the number of units expected to go into service or the assumed probability that they will go into service, etc.
8. In the context of the Conservation and Load Management Program (C&LM Program), explain the difference between passive and active resources.
9. Is CL&P's C&LM Program limited to passive resources?
