RE: Petition 1310A - Quinebaug Solar, LLC petition for a declaratory ruling, pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes §4-176 and §16-50k, for the proposed construction, maintenance and operation of a 50 megawatt AC solar photovoltaic electric generating facility on approximately 561 acres comprised of 29 separate and abutting privately-owned parcels located generally north of Wauregan Road in Canterbury and south of Rukstela Road and Allen Hill Road in Brooklyn, Connecticut. Reopening of this petition based on changed conditions pursuant to Connecticut General Statutes §4-181a(b). **Request for Revision to Partial Development and Management Plan.**

Dear Ms. Bachman:

On September 22, 2021, Quinebaug Solar, LLC (“Quinebaug”) submitted a filing requesting Connecticut Siting Council (“Council”) approval of a proposed revision to its D&M Plan for the Quinebaug Collector Substation, Eversource Canterbury Switching Station (“Switchyard”) and Project clearing, (“Partial D&M Plan”) approved by the Council on November 20, 2020.

The letter accompanying the filing inadvertently included incorrect information regarding the size of the existing and temporary control structures. The letter stated the following:

“Because the temporary structure would be pre-fabricated, the dimensions would be slightly larger than the permanent enclosure (24 feet by 60 feet by 12 feet tall versus 24 feet by 40 feet by twelve feet tall).”

This is incorrect. The correct dimensions of the permanent and temporary control structures are consistent with those provided in Figure 1 to the September 22, 2021 filing – 70 feet by

28 feet for the temporary control structure and 60 feet by 28 feet for the permanent structure. Please contact the undersigned should you have any additional questions. Thank you.
