Notification of Upstream Change in Ownership of Quinebaug Solar, LLC

Dear Ms. Bachman:

Pursuant to Condition No. 8 of the Connecticut Siting Council's ("Council") April 24, 2020 Findings of Fact, Opinion, and Decision and Order ("Declaratory Ruling") in this proceeding, Quinebaug Solar LLC ("Quinebaug") hereby provides notice to the Council of an internal reorganization of the upstream ownership of Quinebaug.

On November 30, 2021, NextEra Energy Resources, LLC's indirect ownership of Quinebaug was transferred to Stargrass, LLC. NextEra Energy Resources, LLC is a majority indirect parent of Stargrass, LLC. This transaction was not contemplated at or prior to the time the Declaratory Ruling was issued. Quinebaug will continue to own and operate the project, and provides written confirmation that this change in upstream ownership will not impact its continued compliance with the terms, limitations, and conditions contained in the Declaratory Ruling.
