
4. Nature of evidence intervenor intends to present:

Vulnerability of Bridgeport's most intact co-operative housing to pollution, blight, and encroachment by industry. Seaside Village is on the National Historic Register and was built to great architectural acclaim in 1917-1918. Seaside Village houses a very diverse population, including the very young and very old, all income levels, and a great number of ethnicities. Under the CEPA act, Seaside Village and surrounding communities, I believe the installation of a large fuel cell tower will undermine its historic and cultural value, and affect the well-being of its residents.
