The filing fee is applied to the direct costs. For example, if \$1,000 of staff hours accrued, the \$625 filing fee (upfront payment) would first be applied, then the balance would be invoiced (in this case \$375). During the pandemic, instead of collecting the filing fee upfront, the Council is just direct charging. It amounts to the same cost which is the total direct charges associated with a petition.
