Owen Clark, Mortimer Gelston and Robert Erling met John Bean of Storer Cable and Robert K. Killian Jr., its attorney, for a field review of Petition No. 112. Storer Broadcasting is petitioning the Council for a ruling that no certificate of environmental compatibility and public need is needed for its replacement of an existing tower and construction of a new service building. Storer proposes to replace the existing 372' tower structure with a new stronger 360' tower. Storer maintains a new tower is necessary to support a side-mounted 64' UHF antenna, and provide flexibility for any future expansion. Storer holds the position that this UHF antenna does not fall under the authority of the Siting Council.

Storer plans to construct a new storage building, measuring 25' x 40', within the fenced confines of this site. The company did not include any building plans with its petition, but at the request of Council members has promised to provide such plans.

Mr. Bean indicated that towers of this type ordinarily have a life expectancy of 10-15 years, and that the existing tower is capable of lasting another 4-5 years. The new tower would be erected within 10' of the existing tower.

Calculated power densities at ground level would be .01036 mW/cm² or less.
