***Heather Burns, CEO, Connecticut Sustainable Business Council
“Environmentally Preferable Purchasing”***

Heather Burns is President of Connecticut Sustainable Business Council, the state's largest network of businesses committed to policies and practices that advance leadership in social, economic and environmental performance. For the past ten years, Heather has consulted organizations, companies and government agencies on sustainability strategies that benefit the triple bottom line while aligning with organizational goals and objectives. She is a certified reporter with Global Reporting Initiative and a recognized stakeholder engagement expert by companies such as Allstate and Merck. Heather serves as Vice Chair of NSF391.1, the first ANSI sustainability standard for professional services. She also provides recommendations to USEPA on the development of guidance on eco-labels and sustainability standards, used in governmental procurement decisions. Heather began her journey in sustainability in 1999 when, working as a Dive Master on a small island in the Gulf of Thailand, she noticed that two industries – fishing and tourism – could benefit from understanding sustainable business practices. She and a team of divers founded Save the Reef Foundation, which continues its work today. She has been recognized locally and nationally for her work in sustainability, innovation and social impact by organizations such as Buckminster Fuller Institute Challenge recognizing projects utilizing a whole systems approach to innovating wide scale social and environmental impact. Locally, she has been recognized by Morris Media Green Awards for positive contributions to the community, and the Best of the Gold Coast Awards. A published writer and professional editor, in 2007 Heather founded Connecticut’s first sustainability related blog, www.CTGreenScene.com. Live events around the state brought a wide range of stakeholders together to share ideas and brainstorm solutions and garnered media ...
