Tent Inspections: Outdoor Dining Case Study

This webinar series will present the requirements of the Connecticut Fire Safety Codes and Connecticut State Building Codes regarding the inspection of tents and temporary structures used for outdoor dining as a result of the COVID 19 virus and a case study of outdoor dining in local jurisdictions. Discussion will involve the applicable provisions of the code and challenges maintaining code compliance of these structures. The first session will cover an overview of the events leading to the increased use of tents for outdoor dining, basic building and fire code requirements for tents used for outdoor dining and com-

mon code compliance issues that resulted in the increased use of tents. The second session will provide a case study of tents used for outdoor dining in local jurisdictions, the coordination code inspection and permit requirements between local building and fire officials along with common code compliance issues when electrical power and heating is used in these venues. This session will conclude with a discussion of frequently asked questions a municipal building or fire official may receive from the local business owners and operators on the use of tents for dining. *Instructors: Tim Mikloiche, Building Official, West Hartford and Mike Sinsigalli, Fire Marshal, Windsor Locks*

On the Day of Training

To participate in an OEDM webinar, you'll need an internet connection with Google Chrome, Edge, Firefox or Safari browser.

If you attended OEDM webinars last semester, just log in fifteen minutes before the start of the training.

If this is your first time using Blackboard Collaborate, log in to the training 30 minutes early to make sure you have no technical issues. The latest you can log in for a technical check is ten minutes prior to the start of class; for morning classes log in by 8:50 a.m., for evening classes log in by 5:50 p.m.

Once you've logged on, type your first and last name and ETC number into the Chat. You can reach the Chat by clicking on the purple tab in the lower right corner of the screen. **This is how we will track attendance.**
