The Connecticut Green LEAF Schools Program has the following goals:

Provide effective environmental and sustainability education,

Improve the health and wellness of students and staff, including: an integrated school environmental health program; standards for nutrition and fitness; and quality outdoor time; and

Reduce environmental impact and cost, including: maximizing building energy and water efficiency; encouraging waste reduction; and promoting alternative transportation use.

We recognize that each of these goals is important to your schools and communities, and that you may already be making progress in many of these areas. The Connecticut Green LEAF Schools Program supports and encourages your efforts by providing resources and professional development to improve the sustainability of all Connecticut schools.
