NEW BILLS OF INTEREST

Proposed <u>S.B. No. 28</u> SEN. WITKOS, 8th DIST. 'AN ACT ALLOWING ADVANCED PRACTICE REGISTERED NURSES TO CONCLUDE THAT A PERSON HAS PSYCHIATRIC DISABILITIES AND IS DANGEROUS TO HIMSELF OR HERSELF OR OTHERS FOR PURPOSES OF CONFINEMENT IN A HOSPITAL FOR PSYCHIATRIC DISABILITIES UNDER AN EMERGENCY CERTIFICATE', to allow advanced practice registered nurses to conclude that a person has psychiatric disabilities and is dangerous to himself or herself or others for purposes of confinement to a hospital for psychiatric disabilities under an emergency certificate. **REF. PUBLIC HEALTH**

Proposed <u>S.B. No. 38</u> SEN. GERRATANA, 6th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE PROVISION OF SERVICES TO PERSONS WITH AN INTELLECTUAL OR DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITY', to prevent disruption of services to persons with an intellectual or developmental disability. REF. PUBLIC HEALTH

Proposed <u>S.B.</u> No. <u>39</u> SEN. GERRATANA, 6th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING A PUBLIC-PRIVATE PARTNERSHIP TO PROVIDE QUALITY SUPPORTS AND SERVICES FOR PERSONS WITH INTELLECTUAL AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES', to provide continuum of care options, improve jobs and reduce the waiting list for services and supports for persons with intellectual and developmental disabilities. **REF.** PUBLIC HEALTH

Proposed <u>S.B. No. 66</u> SEN. MARKLEY, 16th DIST.; SEN. SUZIO, 13th DIST. 'AN ACT REQUIRING CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORDS CHECKS OF PRINCIPALS OF PROSPECTIVE STATE CONTRACTORS', to require all principals of prospective state contractors to submit to criminal history records checks. **REF.** GOVERNMENT ADMINISTRATION AND ELECTIONS

Proposed <u>S.B. No. 84</u> SEN. LINARES, 33rd DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING GPS MONITORING OF CONVICTED PERSONS AWAITING SENTENCING FOR AGGRAVATED SEXUAL ASSAULT', to require a person convicted of aggravated sexual assault who remains free pending sentencing to be monitored by a global positioning system. REF. JUDICIARY

Proposed <u>S.B. No. 111</u> SEN. FORMICA, 20th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING NOTIFICATION TO SCHOOLS OF PROTECTIVE OR RESTRAINING ORDERS AFFECTING STUDENTS', to require notice be sent to schools when a student is named in a protective or restraining order. REF. JUDICIARY

S.R. No. 8 SEN. LOONEY, 11th DIST. 'RESOLUTION APPROVING THE SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT IN JUAN F., ET AL. V. DANNEL MALLOY, ET AL' REF. APPROPRIATIONS

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5127</u> REP. PISCOPO, 76th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING A FOSTER CARE STIPEND FOR GRANDPARENTS AWARDED CUSTODY OF GRANDCHILDREN', to assist grandparents who have been awarded custody of their grandchildren. REF. HUMAN SERVICES

Proposed H.B. No. 5140 REP. PERILLO, 113th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING REIMBURSEMENTS TO HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS FOR COVERED SERVICES PROVIDED FOR THE TREATMENT OF A SUBSTANCE USE DISORDER', to require insurance companies, health care companies, fraternal benefit societies and other entities that provide coverage for the treatment of a substance use disorder to reimburse health care providers directly, rather than insureds, for services provided by such provider for the treatment of the substance use disorder. REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5170</u> REP. TWEEDIE, 13th DIST. 'AN ACT PROHIBITING THE DISPENSING OF OPIOIDS OUTSIDE OF A HOSPITAL SETTING TO ANY PERSON UNDER THE AGE OF EIGHTEEN', to combat the abuse of opioids. REF. PUBLIC HEALTH

Proposed H.B. No. 5172 REP. PERILLO, 113th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING STAFFING AT STATE-OPERATED FACILITIES FOR THE TREATMENT OF PERSONS WITH SUBSTANCE USE DISORDERS', to rationalize patient care at state-operated facilities for the treatment of persons with substance use disorders. REF. PUBLIC HEALTH

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5203</u> REP. BELSITO, 53rd DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING ANNUAL LICENSES', to mitigate the administrative burden of annual licensing and reduce license fee costs. **REF. GENERAL LAW**

Proposed H.B. No. 5208 REP. CARPINO, 32nd DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING LEGAL PROTECTIONS FOR A PERSON WHO ENTERS AN AUTOMOBILE TO PROVIDE EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE TO A CHILD', to provide legal protections to a person who enters the automobile of another, including an entry by force, to render emergency assistance to a child. REF. JUDICIARY

Proposed H.B. No. 5224 REP. HARDING, 107th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING AN INVESTIGATION OF POLICIES REGARDING TERMINATION OF PARENTAL RIGHTS AND PARENTAL NEGLECT', to determine the efficacy of policies concerning termination of parental rights and determinations of parental neglect. REF. COMMITTEE ON CHILDREN

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5227</u> REP. SREDZINSKI, 112th DIST. 'AN ACT DELAYING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE STUDENT DATA PRIVACY ACT', to allow school districts to delay the implementation of the provisions of public act 16-189 relating to student data privacy. **REF. EDUCATION**

Proposed H.B. No. 5232 REP. HARDING, 107th DIST. 'AN ACT DELAYING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE STUDENT DATA PRIVACY ACT FOR ONE SCHOOL YEAR', to allow school districts to delay the implementation of the provisions of public act 16-189 relating to student data privacy. REF. EDUCATION Proposed H.B. No. 5233 REP. HARDING, 107th DIST. Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5311</u> REP. SCANLON, 98th DIST. 'AN ACT ESTABLISHING RECOVERY HIGH SCHOOLS', to establish recovery high schools in Connecticut for the purpose of educating students recovering from substance abuse. REF. EDUCATION

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5318</u> REP. BETTS, 78th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING PRIVATIZING DELIVERY OF UP TO FIFTY PER CENT OF SOCIAL SERVICES BY NONPROFITS', to provide higher quality social services at less expense. REF. HUMAN SERVICES

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5329</u> REP. SRINIVASAN, 31st DIST. 'AN ACT REDUCING THE SALARIES OF LEGISLATORS, COMMISSIONERS OF STATE AGENCIES AND THE GOVERNOR', to reduce the pay of legislators, commissioners and the Governor. REF. APPROPRIATIONS

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5363</u> REP. ABERCROMBIE, 83rd DIST.; SEN. MOORE, 22nd DIST.; SEN. SLOSSBERG, 14th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING INTERPRETERS FOR DEAF AND HARD OF HEARING PERSONS', to ensure that persons who are deaf and hard of hearing have access to adequate and effective interpreting services. REF. HUMAN SERVICES

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5379</u> REP. SRINIVASAN, 31st DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING MENTAL, EMOTIONAL AND BEHAVIORAL HEALTH SERVICES FOR CHILDREN', to strengthen the provision of mental, emotional and behavioral health services to children. REF. PUBLIC HEALTH

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5380</u> REP. ARCONTI, 109th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE AVAILABILITY OF EPINEPHRINE IN PUBLIC VENUES', to make emergency epinephrine in cartridge injectors more widely available to people who suffer anaphylactic symptoms in public venues. REF. PUBLIC HEALTH

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5402</u> REP. DAVIS, 57th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING CAMERA AND COMPUTER REPAIR PERSONNEL AS MANDATED REPORTERS', to expand mandatory reporting laws. REF. COMMITTEE ON CHILDREN

roposed <u>H.B. No. 5423</u> REP. DAVIS, 57th DIST. 'AN ACT ESTABLISHING A SEARCHABLE DATABASE OF CONVICTED ANIMAL ABUSERS', to create a searchable database of convicted animal abusers. **REF.** ENVIRONMENT

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5440 REP. KUPCHICK</u>, 132nd DIST. 'AN ACT EXPANDING HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR THE TREATMENT OF MENTAL OR NERVOUS CONDITIONS', to expand health insurance coverage for the treatment of mental or nervous conditions. **REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE**

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5441</u> REP. KUPCHICK, 132nd DIST. 'AN ACT REQUIRING HEALTH INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR LONG-TERM ADDICTION TREATMENT', to require health insurance coverage for long-term addiction treatment. REF. INSURANCE AND REAL ESTATE

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5442</u> REP. COOK, 65th DIST. 'AN ACT RAISING THE LEGAL AGE TO MARRY TO EIGHTEEN', to prevent forced marriages. REF. JUDICIARY

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5454</u> REP. MUSHINSKY, 85th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING AN ENGAGEMENT MODEL OF MENTAL HEALTH CARE', to utilize trained volunteers to improve outcomes and reduce the cost of mental health care in the state. REF. PUBLIC HEALTH

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5470 REP. YACCARINO, 87th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING SECURITY FREEZES ON MINOR CHILDREN'S CREDIT REPORTS', to protect the credit of minor children. REF. BANKING</u>

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5471</u> REP. HARDING, 107th DIST. 'AN ACT INCREASING PENALTIES FOR CRIMES COMMITTED AGAINST CHILDREN', to increase the penalties for crimes committed against children. REF. COMMITTEE ON CHILDREN

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5472</u> REP. CAMILLO, 151st DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE EXPLOITATION OF CHILDREN IN PANHANDLING', to prevent the exploitation of children in panhandling. REF. COMMITTEE ON CHILDREN

Proposed H.B. No. 5484 REP. CHEESEMAN, 37th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE ALTERNATIVE EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITY REQUIREMENT FOR EXPELLED STUDENTS', to amend the amount of instructional time that school districts are required to provide to students who have been expelled. REF. EDUCATION

Proposed H.B. No. 5662 REP. MCCARTY, 38th DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING THE COORDINATED DELIVERY OF MENTAL HEALTH CARE', to coordinate the delivery of mental health services and to notify parents of available services for children and young adults. **REF. PUBLIC HEALTH**

Proposed <u>H.B. No. 5663</u> REP. GENGA, 10th DIST.; REP. KOKORUDA, 101st DIST. 'AN ACT CONCERNING SMOKING IN MOTOR VEHICLES', to protect children from secondhand smoke while riding in a motor vehicle. REF. PUBLIC HEALTH

PROGRAM', to encourage innovation and efficiency by allowing savings to be retained by a health or human services provider at the end of the provider's contractual term with a state agency to reinvest such savings into service delivery, provided the state agency determines that the provider has complied with its contractual and other service delivery requirements. **REF.
