I make the following statement, without fear, threat or promise. I have been advised that any statement(s) made herein which I do not believe to be true, and which statement is intended to mislead a public servant in the performance of his / her official function, is a crime under C.G.S. section 53a-157b and is punishable by law. (C)

On May 9, 2017 I was assigned to the west side as B-3. At approximately 1701 hours, I heard a transmission over the radio that gang unit-Detective Borrico observed a stolen vehicle in the area of Laurel Avenue and Park Avenue and he was requesting a marked police cruiser to assist. The directions continued being called out on channel 1-right on Park Avenue, left on Washington Avenue, then a transmission came over the radio of Shots Fired, Walgreens-Fairfield Avenue. At the time of the shots fired transmission, I was on Washington Avenue near Coleman Street. I arrived on scene in my marked police cruiser and pulled into the Walgreens parking lot and exited my vehicle. I observed two parties laying on the ground, handcuffed, bleeding, and what appeared to be a motor vehicle accident involving A-23 and civilian vehicles. I believe I was the first Supervisor on scene after the incident.

I immediately walked over to the scene and spoke to Officer Diez who stated that Officer Boulay fired his weapon and was injured in the accident. I advised Officer Diez to immediately transport Officer Boulay to St. Vincent's Hospital to be evaluated. I advised Officer Bobby Jones to transport Boulay's partner, Officer Pecirep, to St. Vincent's Hospital to be evaluated. At this time, I continued to advise Officers to secure the crime scene by strategically placing Officers in the Walgreens parking lot and all along the sidewalks as well as having crime scene tape put up.

I remained at the scene until around 2000 hours when I left to respond to a violent assault involving a hammer on Fairfield Avenue. Sergeant Delgado remained on scene while I was gone as well as numerous Officers. I returned to the scene at approximately 2200 hours to assess the number of protestors that were there. It appeared to be approximately 60 protestors on scene and they remained there until around 0100 hours. I remained on scene until I was relieved by Captain Gilleran at approximately 0330 hours.
