Interview Report: Sergeant Sean Lynch

On 06/06/2017 at approximately 1705 hours, I met with Sergeant Sean Lynch at the Troop G Barracks. At that time, Sergeant Lynch provided me with a two-page typewritten statement which included his observations and involvement in the initial response to the Use of Force incident which occurred on 05/09/2017 at approximately 1701 hours on Fairfield Avenue near the intersection of Park Avenue. What appears below is a summarization of the statement with pertinent quoted segments in italics. This summary report does not constitute a full review of the complete statement of Sergeant Lynch, which is attached to this report.

On 05/09/2017 at approximately 1703 hours, Sergeant Lynch was assigned as the patrol supervisor of the Green Sector, which includes the east portion of the city of Bridgeport, when he responded to the area of Fairfield Avenue and Park Avenue following a radio transmission of shots fired in connection to an incident involving a stolen motor vehicle.

Sergeant Lynch reported he arrived on scene at approximately 1710 hours as medical personnel were also arriving. In his statement, Sergeant Lynch included that, *"I observed a handcuffed male party (later identified as Jayson Negron) down on the north side of a grey Subaru Forrester [sic]. He appeared unresponsive. I also observed a handcuffed male party (later identified as) on the southern side of the vehicle. Patrol officers were securing the crime scene and medical personnel were assessing."*

Sergeant Lynch noted the Subaru was stopped facing the wrong way (eastbound) on Fairfield Avenue a short distance from the parking lot apron from the Walgreens Pharmacy. In front of the Subaru was an

occupied minivan and behind the Subaru was a marked police vehicle.

Sergeant Lynch wrote, *"The Subaru had the driver's door open and it appeared bent well beyond normal opening range."* Sergeant Lynch proceeded to secure and manage the scene, along with the scene commander, Captain Kevin Gilleran. Sergeant Lynch noted that he expanded the crime scene into the Walgreens parking lot in order to *"provide a more substantial physical and visual barrier. This was done to protect the scene and personnel at the parking lot access point to Fairfield Ave. and as much as practicably give some level of dignity to the decedent (Negron). There was, at this time, a growing crowd all with cell phones as well as legitimate media responding."*

When the scene had been secured, Sergeant Lynch was directed by Lt. Sapiro to gather the extent of the officers' injuries and secure any and all potential evidence (uniforms, clothing, and duty weapons). Sergeant Lynch proceeded to Saint Vincent's Medical Center where he met with Officers Boulay and Pecirep. Sergeant Lynch advised the officers of the expected next steps in the investigation, and he secured them replacement clothing and gear. Sergeant Lynch assigned Ofc. Julio Diez to collect Ofc. Boulay's equipment, and for Ofc. Bobby Jones to collect Ofc. Mario Pecirep's gear.
