I make the following statement, without fear, threat or promise. I have been advised that any statement(s) made herein which I do not believe to be true, and which statement is intended to mislead a public servant in the performance of his / her official function, is a crime under C.G.S. section 53a-157b and is punishable by law. *(initials)*

On 5/09/17 at approximately 1703 hours I responded to the area of Fairfield Avenue and Park Avenue. I responded after a radio transmission of shots fired shortly after units responded to a report of a stolen vehicle. I was assigned as a patrol supervisor in the green sector which is essentially the East portion of the City of Bridgeport.

I arrived at the intersection of Fairfield Avenue and West Avenue at approximately 1710 hours as medical personnel arrived on scene. I observed a handcuffed male party down on the north side of a grey Subaru Forrester. He appeared unresponsive. I also observed a handcuffed male party on the southern side of the vehicle. Patrol officers were securing crime scene and medical personnel were assessing. The Subaru was facing Eastbound on Fairfield Ave. which is a one way westbound only street. The vehicle was a short distance from the parking lot apron from Walgreens Pharmacy.

The Subaru had an occupied minivan in the front (eastward) and marked police vehicles behind it. The Subaru had the driver's door open and it appeared bent well beyond normal opening range. I asked the occupant of the minivan if he was injured and he stated he was not and I directed an officer to stay with him as a witness and to gather relevant identification.

At this time the initial crime scene had been established. Capt. Gilleran was on scene and assumed command. Other supervisory personnel were also on-scene assigned to that area. I proceeded to assist them and to further expand and control the crime scene. I directed officers to control westbound traffic at Fairfield

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Ave. and West Ave. and subsequently block westbound traffic at Courtland Street to minimize gridlock. I advised dispatch of units assigned to this task.

I also expanded the crime scene into the Walgreens parking lot. I did this with available personnel barrier tape and police vehicles. I utilized secondary response vehicles that were not near or part of the initial scene to provide a more substantial physical and visual barrier. This was done to protect the scene and personnel at the parking lot access points to Fairfield Ave. and as much as practicable give some level of dignity to the decedent. There was, at this time, a growing crowd all with cell phones as well as legitimate media responding.

At this point the crime scene was secure. I met with Lt. Sapiro and was directed to gather the extent of the officer's injuries and secure any and all potential evidence such as uniform clothing and duty pistols. I then responded to St. Vincent's Hospital and met with the involved officers who were being treated. I advised them of what was likely to occur as far as investigative procedure. I facilitated the process of getting them clothing and replacement duty pistols. I assigned Officers Diez to secure Officer Boulay's duty gear and clothing and Officer Jones to do the same with Officer Pecirep. Both Officers Diez and Jones completed reports detailing their actions.
