On October 9, 2014, after due and proper notice, the Department of Consumer Protection, Liquor Control Commission, held a formal administrative hearing on a question of Sec. 30-46(a)(5) of the Connecticut General Statutes concerning the right to occupy the proposed premises, and Sec. 30-6-A1(a) of the Regulations of Connecticut State Agencies concerning an alleged failure to supply documents and certifications in connection with this new application. The respondent appeared through counsel.

Based upon the testimony and documents submitted at the hearing, the Department of Consumer Protection finds the respondent to be in violation of both charges; specifically, the department finds that the respondent does not have the right to occupy the proposed premises and that the respondent has not supplied required documents and certifications, and **ORDERS** your application for a package store liquor permit DENIED.
