Commission Action: Commissioner Carbray moved, seconded by Commissioner Linder the above relocation request passed by a vote of 5-0 to and provided all the requirements set forth in the Connecticut Pharmacy and Drug Laws as enforced by the Commission of Pharmacy are met.

Legal Matters

Case Number: 2022-1486 Benzer Pharmacy; PCN.3657

Attorney Michael Ando presented this case.

Respondent is a Nonresident Pharmacy that was investigated following a complaint of improper licensing. It was determined that this pharmacy had changed its name in its home state and had failed to notify the Connecticut Commission of Pharmacy of a change in name of the pharmacy.

Proposed Resolution:

Counsel for Drug Control proposes a resolution in which the Respondent shall appropriately change the pharmacy name as required under Connecticut Statutes and shall pay a voluntary monetary settlement payment of \$1,000.

Commission Action: Commissioner DeFazio moved, seconded by Commissioner Inguanti and passed by a vote of 5-0 to accept and approve the aforementioned settlement agreement.

Case Number: 2022-1487 Benzer NJ 3 LLC; PCN.3585

Attorney Michael Ando presented this case.

Respondent is a Nonresident Pharmacy that was investigated for failure to report disciplinary action in its home state to the Connecticut Commission of Pharmacy. It was determined that the pharmacy failed to report discipline and subsequently changed ownership. The new ownership also failed to report the discipline. Additionally, the new ownership changed the pharmacy's name in its home state but failed to appropriately notify the Connecticut Commission of Pharmacy of a change in name of the pharmacy.

Legal Matters Cont.

Proposed Resolution:

Counsel for Drug Control proposes a resolution in which the Respondent shall appropriately change the pharmacy name as required under Connecticut Statutes, and shall follow the requirements of Connecticut law, including reporting requirements to the Commission and Drug Control Division. Respondent shall additionally pay a voluntary settlement amount of \$2,000.

Commission Action: Commissioner Inguanti moved, seconded by Commissioner Linder and passed by a vote of 5-0 to accept and approve the aforementioned settlement agreement.

Case Number: 2021-1184 **Optum Infusion Services 500 Inc.; PCY.2363** Attorney Michael Ando presented this case.

Respondent is a Connecticut Pharmacy determined to have failed to notify the Department of Consumer Protection in writing no later than ten days prior to installing a new primary engineering Control (PEC) in the pharmacy's clean room. Following contact from Drug Control Division, management indicated failure to notify was an error and immediately altered standard operating procedures to ensure such oversight would not reoccur. Environmental monitoring tested appropriately during this time, and the pharmacy was at all times cooperative and responsive.

Proposed Resolution:

Counsel for the Drug Control Division proposes an agreement in which Respondent shall pay a voluntary settlement amount of \$1,000, which has been paid. Respondent has additionally and voluntarily adjusted operating procedures.

Commission Action: Commissioner Inguanti moved, seconded by Commissioner Linder and passed by a vote of 5-0 to accept and approve the aforementioned settlement agreement.

Case Number: 2021-85 **Costco Pharmacy #324**; **PCY.1751** Attorney Michael Ando presented this case.

Respondent is a Connecticut Pharmacy investigated following a notification of multiple controlled substance losses. During investigation, violations were discovered including incomplete recordkeeping in a suitable file; misbranded drugs in pharmaceutical stock; failure to adequately controlled substances except for the actual time required to remove or replace needed items, and failure to timely report loss of controlled substances. This investigation also resulted in disciplinary actions against a pharmacist manager and staff pharmacist. As a result of Drug Control and internal investigation, the pharmacy replaced the staff of this pharmacy.

Legal Matters Cont.

Proposed Resolution:

Counsel for Drug Control proposes a settlement in which Respondent shall pay a voluntary monetary settlement amount of \$15,000. Respondent has voluntarily undertaken extensive staffing and oversight changes and has voluntarily implemented changes to improve and maintain drug security.

Commission Action: Commissioner Inguanti moved, seconded by Commissioner Linder and passed by a vote of 5-0 to accept and approve the aforementioned settlement agreement.

Case Number: 2022-1546 Rite Aid #10376; PCY.1264

Attorney Michael Ando presented this case.

Respondent is a Connecticut Pharmacy that was investigated following a complaint that the retail pharmacy was closed on several occasions during business hours. It was determined that there were four unscheduled closings in a short period. The unscheduled closings were resolved when the location was able to address a staffing shortage. The location failed to timely report the closures to the Commission of Pharmacy within 72 hours as required.

Proposed Resolution:

Counsel for Drug Control Proposes a settlement in which Respondent shall pay a voluntary monetary settlement amount of \$1,000. Respondent shall follow notification requirements as outlined in Connecticut law.

Commission Action: Commissioner Inguanti moved, seconded by Commissioner Linder and passed by a vote of 5-0 to accept and approve the aforementioned settlement agreement.

'First Time' Pharmacy Manager (s)

The following pharmacists presented themselves to the Commission of Pharmacy as 'first time' pharmacy managers in the State of Connecticut:

Commissioner DeFazio provided a summary of the responsibilities that a first-time

pharmacy manager has and appreciated their appearance before the Commission. Commissioner DeFazio emphasized the importance of the pharmacy manager's role in contrast to the front-store manager (in many retail settings). Some responsibilities include leadership, technician registration, license renewals, reporting pharmacy operation hours, and prescription error reporting.
