DN 08-709 Richard Olsen committed a prescription error. Proposed agreement is for a letter of reprimand. *Commissioner Beaudin motioned, seconded by Commissioner Goodmaster and this agreement was accepted by the Commission of Pharmacy by a vote of 5-0.*

DN 08-917 Grade A Shop Rite violated HIPAA by disclosing confidential information. Proposed agreement is for a letter of caution to the pharmacists, Leena John and Helen Trinh, and a \$500 civil penalty to the pharmacy. *Commissioner Vegliante motioned, seconded by Commissioner Inguanti and this agreement was accepted by the Commission of Pharmacy by a vote of 5-0.*

DN 07-736 During a routine inspection, Brooks Pharmacy was found to be in violation of various Connecticut regulations. Proposed agreement is for a \$1000 Civil penalty. Commissioner Inguanti motioned, seconded by Commissioner Vegliante and this agreement was accepted by the Commission of Pharmacy by a vote of 5-0.
