Legal Matters

DN 08-1638 Pharmacist, Mark Cottle, who surrendered his license in 2007 for drug diversion has satisfied the Department and has taken necessary steps to regain his license. *Approved agreement is a typical settlement agreement for license reinstatement.*

DN 08-1743 Pharmacist, Puja Bhalodi, disclosed a customer's confidential information. Approved agreement is for a \$500 civil penalty and to take the continuing education course.

DN 08-1647 Pharmacist, Robert Berlin, knowingly and willfully submitted fraudulent prescriptions to insurance companies, most notably ConnectiCare, and received payments

totaling approximately \$564,667.88 from these companies. *Approved agreement is for license suspension. Pharmacist may request reinstatement after 33 months.*

Discussion of proposed changes to the handling of prescription error cases: First-time errors will continue to be handled as they are now. However, when an error is made for the second time within a three-year period, the following may occur:

- The pharmacist will be required to take the CE course currently offered along with receiving a letter of reprimand
- Depending on the nature of the error and the time between errors, the pharmacist may be required to pay a civil penalty; a review of the pharmacist and the pharmacy error history will be conducted as well.
