Docket Number 15-765 Lisa J. Jaser

Attorney Antonio Santoro presented this case. No Commissioner 'stepped down'. This case involved on or about September 22, 2015, Licensee, as Pharmacy Director of Hospital, had not begun implementing all required USP 797 standards. To resolve this matter the department recommends the issue of a letter of reprimand.

Commission Action: Commissioner DeFazio moved, seconded by Commissioner Beaudin and passed by a vote of 5-0 to accept and approve the aforementioned settlement agreement. Commissioner Goodmaster abstained from voting on all legal matters.

Docket Number 16-54 Peter B C D'Aprile

Attorney Antonio Santoro presented this case. No Commissioner 'stepped down'. This case involved: At times during the period on or about June 1, 2015 to November 1, 2015, Licensee provided misinformation on pharmacy technician applications, exceeded the ratio of pharmacy technicians to pharmacists, and allowed pharmacy technician registration more than 30 days after start of training.

To resolve this matter the department is recommending a civil penalty of \$4500.00.

Commission Action: Commissioner Beaudin moved, seconded by Commissioner DeFazio and passed by a vote of 5-0 to accept and approve the aforementioned settlement agreement. Commissioner Goodmaster abstained from voting on all legal matters.

Attorney Antonio Santoro presented this case. No Commissioner 'stepped down'. This case involved The Licensee has been investigated for failing to perform a quality assurance and documentation. To resolve this issue the department is recommending a civil penalty of \$1000.00.

Commission Action: Commissioner Beaudin moved, seconded by Commissioner Inguanti and passed by a vote of 5-0 to accept and approve the aforementioned settlement agreement. Commissioner Goodmaster abstained from voting on all legal matters.

Attorney Antonio Santoro presented this case. No Commissioner 'stepped down'. This case involved The Licensee has been investigated for failing to immediately enroll with the Commission of Pharmacy the name, address and license number of the pharmacist who assumes management of the pharmacy. To resolve this matter the Department recommends payment of \$1000.00 civil penalty.

Commission Action: Commissioner DeFazio moved, seconded by Commissioner Beaudin and passed by a vote of 5-0 to accept and approve the aforementioned settlement agreement. Commissioner Goodmaster abstained from voting on all legal matters.

Docket Number 16-66 Stop and Shop Pharmacy #674
Attorney Antonio Santoro presented this case. No Commissioner 'stepped down'. This case involved Licensee permitted the disclosure of a customer's confidential pharmacy information. To resolve this matter the Department recommends a civil penalty of \$1000.00.

Commission Action: Commissioner Inguanti moved, seconded by Commissioner Carbray and passed by a vote of 5-0 to accept and approve the aforementioned settlement agreement. Commissioner Goodmaster abstained from voting on all legal matters.

Docket Number 16-87 The Medicine Shoppe

Attorney Antonio Santoro presented this case. No Commissioner 'stepped down'. This case involved The name of the pharmacist manager was not conspicuously posted within the prescription department of the pharmacy, or in immediate proximity to it; and A written copy of the quality assurance program was not maintained on the pharmacy premise and readily available to all pharmacy personnel and the Department of Consumer Protection; A sign stating "This pharmacy may be able to substitute a less expensive drug product which is therapeutically equivalent to the one prescribed by your doctor unless you do not approve" was not posted; Non-legend drugs were sold at retail in the absence of an approved pharmacy license or a permit to sell non-legend drugs; and, An inventory of all stocks of controlled substances on hand was not taken on the date The, CT first engaged in the dispensing of controlled substances. To resolve this matter the department recommends the payment of \$500.00 civil penalty.

Commission Action: The Commission voted down the above recommendation. Commissioner DeFazio moved to increase the fine to \$1000.00 civil penalty. Commissioner Beaudin moved, seconded by Commissioner Inguanti and passed by a vote of 5-0 to accept and approve the aforementioned settlement agreement increase. Commissioner Goodmaster abstained from voting on all legal matters.
