

## Reopening of Camp Harkness – Phase 4

### Camp Site Openings

This document is to announce **Phase 4** of reopening Camp Harkness, beginning *July 24, 2020*. Phase 4 will include the following changes:

- Campers who have made Camp site reservations (confirmed between January & March) for July 24, 2020 through Labor Day weekend 2020 (September 6-7, 2020) will be able to keep their reservations.
- Campers who have had reservations cancelled (for June 10- July 10, 2020) due to COVID-19 restrictions, will be given first choice for openings.
- Campers who would like to make a new reservation can call the office at (860)443-7818 for availability or to be placed on the waiting list. Passes are required. Guests are limited to 5 per passholder and names of guests will be kept on a list. Passholders must be in attendance.
- The fully accessible family bathroom with a shower will be open for campers use, but the remainder of the bath house will be closed. Port-a-lets and handwashing stations are also available for campers. Please take into consideration that facilities are sanitized on a regular basis throughout the day and evening but not after each use.
- The number of campers will be included in the daily visitor count, increased to 100 visitors in the park at any one time as of July 24, 2020.
- Upon arrival, campers will be required to check -in and show their pass to the booth operator. Adult guests may be asked for a photo I.D. All campers will be required to wear wristbands throughout their reservation time to identify them as authorized park visitors.
- Each site has a picnic table (which will be sterilized between reservations) and a wheelchair accessible grill/fire ring.
- Campers will be required to make a reservation for a beach spot each day, as socially distanced areas have been measured out, and availability is limited.
- If any of the campers or guests are not feeling well or are exhibiting COVID-19 symptoms, they are asked to cancel their reservation. If anyone begins to experience symptoms during their stay, they are asked to advise the camp director and end their visit. COVID-19 symptoms include:
  - Cough
  - Shortness of Breath or difficulty breathing

- Fever
  - Chills
  - Muscle Pain
  - Sore Throat
  - New loss of taste or smell
  - Diarrhea or vomiting
- All campers are required to practice proper social distancing; staying at least 6 feet from other household groups or individuals.
  - All campers are asked to bring face coverings and use them whenever they are in close proximity of others. According to [Governor Lamont's Executive Order 7BB](#), the public is required to wear face coverings in public wherever close contact (less than 6 ft.) is unavoidable, unless they have a health condition that prevents it. At Camp Harkness these areas include parking lots and when passing other visitors on trails, paths, or the beach.
