Pappanikou Center, director of the Connecticut Children's Medical Center Family Center and a State and Regional Coordinator for Family Voices. She has done significant work in family advocacy and support, and is a founding member of the Family Voices national organization. She was recognized by the US Department of Health and Human Services in 2010 as a Champion in the field of Maternal and Child Health.

"I am extremely honored to have been given this opportunity to lead the Connecticut Council on Developmental Disabilities," said Ms. Cole. "Council members represent a vast array of skill and expertise from across the state which can be used to significantly improve the full inclusion of people with disabilities in our communities across Connecticut."
