BACKGROUND

Transportation

Transportation is a service offered to enable you to get to your place of employment or community-based day supports. This may include agency provided transportation, pre-purchased bus tickets / paratransit bus passes, or private transportation. Payment per mile is made for a maximum of one round trip daily. Wheelchair accessible transportation is paid at a higher rate only if the individual requires the use of a wheelchair accessible vehicle.

Non-Driver Identification Card

If you do not have a driver's license, you can apply for a state-issued photo identification card, known as a non-driver ID. This is the primary alternative form of photo id issued by the <u>Department of</u> <u>Motor Vehicles (DMV)</u>.

MTM (previously Veyo)

Non-emergency Medical Transportation (NEMT) for Medicaid members who need to get to and from Medicaid-covered medical services but have no means of transportation.

Travel Training

Travel Training is a statewide program run by the Kennedy Center that will teach you how to safely use public transportation. This is no cost for this program; however, you are required to pay the bus or train fare while training is taking place. Transit Authorities

Paratransit (Door to **Door Bus Service**)

Paratransit or door to door services are provided in all areas with local fixed route bus services for people who can't use the local bus system due to their disability. To use paratransit, you need to first apply for eligibility. Visit the paratransit site for your town to learn more about the application process and service routes and hours.
