### Did Not Meet (1 pt)

- Provides minimal information. Thoughts are not clear and do not demonstrate alignment with readings, videos or other materials that were shared.
- Many errors noted in spelling, punctuation and grammar. Limited ability to convey

### Met Expectation (2 pt)

- Includes essential knowledge about the prompt. Product shows some original thought about the given prompt
- Provides appropriate, thoughtful contribution to the project. Thoughts are clear, succinct and aligned with the reading, videos or other materials that were shared.
- Able to present ideas with minimal errors in spelling, punctuation and grammar.

### Exceeded Expectation (3 pts)

- In-depth answer of the prompt. Subject knowledge is very good. Work shows new ideas and insights.
- Highly skilled presentation of ideas that demonstrate clear understanding of ideas expressed in readings, videos or other materials that were shared
- Project organization and presentation is exceptional with no errors in spelling, punctuation and grammar.
